


I am still looking for cars, and Debbie is still looking for artifacts so come on people. If have something, or know of something give one of us a call.

Local Autocross Events by Vern Lyle

If you want to go autocrossing, there is no lack of events. Phila Region of Sports Car Club of America runs a 10-event series locally; Susquehanna Region runs 8-9 events at Gloucester County Community College and the Corvette Council runs a 6-event Fall Series at Hershey. Schedules will be available in the next month or so.

All the above groups run the published SCCA rules. Basically, in Stock classes, you can do the following to the car: Any DOT tire on the standard rim that does not extend beyond bodywork, and lowering is allowed.

In Street Prepared classes you can go a little further: Updating/backdating between the same series of car in the same class (this can get tricky - read the latest rules), intake systems are free, springs can be changed, sway bars and non-triangulated strut braces are allowed, any wheel and any DOT tire is allowed and tires may extend past bodywork, fenders and bumpers may be modified for tire clearance.

SCCA being what it is, you must contend with a vague rulebook and mid-year rule "clarifications". Nobody's perfect, but they have the only game in town.

Our cars run in the following classes for this season:

A Stock - all 911's, 914-6 and 356 4-cam

B Stock - 944 Turbo, 9245 and 928

C Stock - 912 and 914 2.0

D Stock - 944, 914 1.7 and 1.8, all other 356

G Stock - 924 Turbo. Thru a typical oversight, they don't have the 924 listed anywhere - my guess would be here.

SCCA Solo I News

Tentative dates for NEDIV SCCA Solo I events for 1987 were first set at the November NEDIV Convention Meeting at Syracuse N.Y.

March 28/29 - DC Region SCCA plans a Solo I at Summit Point or a drivers school (not a Solo I) at Summit.

May 9/10 - NEPA Region SCCA is trying for the first running of Montage Hillclimb (The Ski Area approach road near Scranton). If it's not possible, then they will run Spring Weatherly Hillclimb as they did in 1986.

May 15,16, or 17 - NEPA Region SCCA, Solo I at Pocono. This event and the May 9/10 hillclimb will not be on back-to-back weekends if both are held.

July 11/12 - NEPA Region SCCA - Giants Despair Hillclimb

August 22/23 - Blue Mountain Region SCCA - Duryea Hillclimb

October 11/12 - NEPA Region - Fall Weatherly Hillclimb. Weatherly will be on this date if the Blue/Gray Road Racing Classic is held on October 3/4 at Summit, but should the Blue/Gray move to October 10/11, Weatherly would then go to October 3/4.

Bill O'Connell and Jess Holshouser are the only Riesentoters I know of who are participating in this series. It's a great sport - ask Bill. Anyone interested contact Jess at 766-8201. Your car and your personal gear must be prepared and out fitted as the you are going SCCA road racing.

BOOK REVIEW

"Panorama-The First Twenty Five Years"

I haven't written a book report since sister Rita Chita's class in 7th grade so maybe I'll call this a book review and go to the back of the class. The book I read is actually a compilation of the best articles from a monthly magazine but it's hard bound and maybe my teacher will think its a real book and give me enough credit to get through English I.

The magazine is Porsche Panorama and the book is entitled "Porsche Panorama - The First Twenty Five Years". If you want to treat yourself to some interesting reading during these long cold winter nights and weekends, here's the ticket!

"Porsche Panorama - The First
Twenty Five Years" is divided into
seven parts: Articles On New Porsches,
Porsche People, PCA Events, Competition, Porsche Features, Porsche Humor
And Historical Notes (ie. How the oldest 911 in the U.S. has over 300,000
miles). What the editors tried and
succeeded in doing was to select articles that capture the personal touch
of Pano that isn't available in other
general enthusiast magazines.

In the section on new Porsches one of the most interesting articles details how the author picks up his Treffen driven 1960 super 90 Roadster from the steamship company and then proceeds to drive it home and preps the car himself - remove the protective paint sealant, wash and wax, adjust the valves and carbs. (This is obviously before dealer prep was invented!) He then compares this car to his previous Porsches both on the road and on the track. After reading about his experiences you realize that people like this were the enthusiasts who laid the foundation for what PCA is today. Because these articles were written from a mid fifties and early sixties viewpoint you become aware of how revolutionary the early Porsches were when compared to their competition at the time.

Congratulations to Don and Doris Reinhard on their 20 years in PCA.

The competition section highlites PCA at it's infancy when a group of amateurs with names like Holbert, Underwood, Jennings and Pupilidy were fighting the odds to take the checkered flag at regional events for this small sports car manufacturer named Porsche. The articles describe how Porsche, not even a decade in the car building business was already making inroads at major events like Sebring, Laguna Seca, and Daytona.

One of the most enjoyable facets of the book was that a number of articles were written by Chuck Beidler, a Riesentoter member and former editor of Pano. and there are also a number of articles about RTR members. All you "Track Heads" would love to read Charlie's article about Horace Ott's trip to the Glen in '57 to run his street speedster in some SCCA races. Entitled "Amateurs Go To The Glen" Charlie describes how Horace prepared the car "so stock it hurt". Set the valves, change the oil, tape the lights, add air to the tires and lets go! There are also articles about Bob Holbert, Bruce Jennings (two) and Bret Everett, a former RTR member from Doylestown who ran successfully in the SCCA in the mid sixties.

I hope I've conveyed the good feeling that you get from reading this book and I know you won't be disappointed if you add this book to your automotive library. Anyway, your seventh grade teacher would have told you to read something more scholastic so you know it has to be good.

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
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AUTOCROSSING - AN OPEN LETTER TO THE EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE AND RIESENTOTER MEMBERSHIP

I read the comments concerning autocrossing contained in Al Anderson's president's message in the January Der Gasser with considerable consternation. At issue is whether Riesentoter should continue to run autocross events beyond the annual pre-season school and Porsche-Corvette Challenge. Al has requested feedback from the membership; since I am an avid autocrosser and strongly oppose discontinuation of the program, I would like to present the other side of the coin, so to speak.

I whole-hearted agree with Al that our autocross program needs a shot in the arm - but how has this situation developed? I doubt that lack of interest is a factor. Certainly, there are not as many avid autocrossers in Riesentoter as there are track enthusiasts - but this alone is not a sound rationale for curtailing the program. I think the problem lies in the failure of old and new autocrossers alike to support their own program through attendance at events, articles in Der Gasser, etc. The latter is an excellent example - with the exception of some fine articles by Vern Lyle and a few others, the autocross enthusiasts (including myself) have been mute in spreading the word of the joys - and pitfalls - of this sport. Regarding the poor attendance at this year's events - again, I don't think this reflects lack of interest, merely the fact that there were problems with advance notice of the events in Der Gasser. One need only look to 1985, when autocross attendance was so good, an extra event was added. Together, these observations suggest that yes, the program does need a good shot in the arm (or seat of the pants), but that the patient is not dead yet.

Riesentoter exists because we own Porsches and love to drive them - eliminate autocrossing and except for an annual rally, members are left with a single opportunity, i.e. high-speed events, to drive aggressively and competitively (and oh yes, legally) - and high-speed is not everyone's cup of tea. The continuation of the Porsche-Corvette Challenge and the pre-season school as a

compromise situation would be a joke, because without an active autocross program, who would want to compete? We need to <u>develop</u> autocrossers, not pretend they don't exist. As a veteran of the SCCA program, I'd rather get my feet wet and practice autocrossing among Riesentoter friends than in front of 100 - 150 strangers at Plymouth Meeting Mall. And speaking of getting your feet wet, who can deny that autocrossing serves as a starting point for those who are interested in, but not yet ready to make the jump to, track events?

To my knowledge (and I could be mistaken on this), an autocross does not cost the club any money, just the time of those responsible for staging the event, and we have never seemed to lack willing helpers. Plus we have had great support from the folks at Autofest. So what if attendance isn't overwhelming? We haven't lost anything, and those who attend surely enjoy an afternoon of fraternity and sociability with fellow Riesentoters. I know that I will do whatever I can to help maintain the autocross program. I would ask the executive committee not to make any hasty decisions concerning autocrossing, and to solicit opinions from the members, perhaps through a questionnaire mailed with Der Gasser. Concomitantly, I would ask the members to participate in and support the program and let your support be known to the executive committee.



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
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
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
