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

RTR AutoX 2008



Au·to·cross (ô'tō-krôs', -krŏs') n. - A form of motor sport that emphasizes safe, low-cost competition and active participation. An autocross is a timed competition where drivers navigate one at a time through a temporary course marked by traffic cones. Autocross tends to place more emphasis on car handling and driver skill than on sheer horsepower.

Welcome to a new year of AutoX with RTR!

2007 was a breakthrough year for Riesentöter Autocross. The program grew from the usual single local event at the Scanticon Center, to a program which involved a 7 event "AutoX+ Roadshow" series, a PAX-based points championship, a novice school held in conjunction with Philly SCCA, lots of pancakes, many new friends, and the occasional beer! As the new incoming chair of 2008, my plan for RTR AutoX this year will be to stay with the same successful format as 2007 . . . but with a few minor tweaks and improvements here and there.

2007 AutoX+ Championship Results

First, before we discuss our plans for 2008, let's review the final positions and points from the inaugural 2007 RTR AutoX+Roadshow Championship. After 7 enjoyable events ranging from Englishtown, NJ to Hershey in central PA, congratulations go to our very own webmaster Pete Majka, who won the overall championship with 145 points. After a close series in which the lead changed many times, Pete finally finished just 1 point ahead of myself in second, with Vytenis Bichnevicius (just call him Veeeeeeeee) coming in a strong third. Final points & positions for the overall championship plus a selection of AutoX photographs from 2007 (including the 3 handsome winners at the holiday party) are shown on the next page. Many thanks to all who attended any of our events in 2007 and we looking forward to seeing you again in 2008!

What's the plan for 2008?

As discussed above, the plan is to keep the same format as last year . . . but with a few minor tweaks and improvements. My first action was to follow in Graham's footsteps by setting up an AutoX sub-committee to help run this year's events. I'm delighted to announce that Beth will return to act as our point person with Philly SCCA, and as I take the step up to AutoX chair, Veeeeeeee will join the team to act as my backup with the additional responsibility of ensuring PAX-factors submitted for the planned championship are fair and accurate. In 2008, we will continue with the successful AutoX+Roadshow & Championship and we aim to hold another AutoX novice school, either alone or in conjunction with Philly SCCA. The Roadshow is a 'just for fun' series for any RTR members interested in attending more local AutoX events. In addition to

holding our own event(s?), we will aim to attend 5 or 6 local PCA & SCCA events over the summer months. For those who would like to compete in our Championship, points will be awarded according to final finishing position, based on a PAX-scoring system designed to even out the performance of different types of cars ñ the monthly schedule and more info will follow in the next couple of months. Most importantly, did you notice the logo on the top right of the page? I am also delighted to announce that SPECIALTY CARS have come back on board as the sponsors of the 2008 RTR AutoX+ Roadshow. The owner, Mark Burkit, has been working on Porsche cars for 28 years, and has built SCCA National XP AutoX Champion Dave Newman's 911 from the ground up. Their shop does everything from PA state inspections, brakes, suspension and oil changes to full restorations and track preparation. We also plan to once again hold our very own RTR AutoX event in 2008 but the secret here is to keep trying to find a new site. The site at the Scanticon Center is small, but very expensive so we are currently looking for a new venue which is bigger and cheaper. We have a couple of very good leads which we are pursuing but if you know of any other potential sites, please contact me and we will follow up. Even though we appreciate your help and enthusiasm, please do not contact the site owners yourself as we don't want to be in the position where several people have the same site suggestion and end up upsetting the owners with multiple phone calls and similar requests.

Finally, my last request is to ask you to check the RTR website and forum regularly for more information. We will aim to update the web and forum in real time as new information becomes available. SO COME ON! Join the Fun! You know you want to! Porsches are meant to be driven and AutoX is a great first step into active autosport. There is not a safer or lower cost way of driving your Porsche on the edge, so if you haven't tried it before, give it a go in 2008!



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2008 Drivers Education Schedule

The registration process for all of the 2008 Riesentöter Drivers Education Events is on-line, using motor-sportreg.com. If you set up an account in 2007 and registered for one or more RTR events, you do not have to make any changes to your account to register for the events in 2008. You can register for our events per the schedule on our website, paying close attention to the opening dates for RTR members and Non RTR members. Registration for the events opens at 12:01AM on the date indicated.

If you already have a Motorsportreg.com account that you have used to register for Non RTR events, please add "PCA - Riesentöter" to your list of clubs in the club membership section and enter your PCA membership number (if applicable).

If you do not have an account, you must create one to register for our events, as this is the only method of registration.

Click on the following URL to be taken to the RTR registration site http://rtr-pca.motorsportreg.com. Proceed to "Create Account" and follow the directions. You must add PCA-Riesentöter as your club in the club memberships section and add your PCA Membership number (if applicable). Enter your information including car information, personal contact, and emergency contact information. Each account must have a unique e-mail address. Please use an email address that you check frequently, as this is the method used to contact you regarding our events.

Once you have created or updated your account, you must be verified as an official RTR member. This last manual step is the only way we can actually ensure we allow official RTR members to be able to register before non-members. You will receive an e-mail from the registrar when your account has been verified. You will not be able to register as an RTR member until this step is complete!!! Don't delay; the registrar will not be responsible to verify last minute accounts on the night registration opens.

Once you have created or updated your account, you can proceed to the Riesentöter specific registration site at http://rtr-pca.motorsportreg.com to see our Riesentöter events.

When you register for an event, you must submit payment, either on- line via credit card (preferred) at the time of registration, or via check (must be received within one week of registration date). The Motorsportreg system will not accept payment if you are put on the waitlist. You will be notified via e-mail if a spot opens up in your run group.


You will receive an email generated by motorsportreg immediately upon completion of your on-line registration request and your status for that event will be "PENDING REVIEW". You will receive an additional email from the Registrar once all of your registration information on the application has been verified and you are confirmed for the event.

Car-Care Tips: Winter Storage 101

You love your baby, and can't wait to take him out on the road again, once the snow melts and those nasty street pebbles have been blown away. But before you fire up that P-car that's been sitting all winter, there are a few things you should know . . .

Set the scene. The ideal storing temperature for any pampered Porsche is at least fifty degrees, according to Ed Tatios, Service Manager at Mike Tillson Motor Car Service, Philadelphia. "A warm, heated garage is best with no drastic temperature changes," says Ed. "If the garage temperature falls below about fifty, or the car is exposed to very cold then very warm temperatures, condensation builds up inside the car. Moisture in the engine, oil, and various components of the car can lead to major repairs."

Charge that battery. "We recommend Battery Tender brand battery chargers," says Tatios. "These maintenance chargers work very well at keeping Porsche batteries charged over the winter."

Run the car regularly. If you don't use a maintenance charger, Ed recommends you run your P-car about every two weeks. "This keeps the battery charged and burns off any condensation that might have formed during storage."

Watch for critters. "Try to make your garage rodent proof," says Ed. "We have a lot of jobs repairing damage rodents have done to hoses, interiors, and cloth roofs." If you have a convertible, keep the roof up during storage to help keep the buggers out.

Up the pressure. To help prevent flat-spotting, increase your tire pressure to the maximum listed on the tire. When you start driving again, don't forget to set them back down again. "Tires generally loose a couple pounds of pressure each month so you're going to want to check your tires before you go out and drive again," advises Ed.

Check the oil. "In Porsche world, you have to start the car and warm it up before you can check the oil," notes Ed. "Once that's done, be sure the oil level is up to where it should be before heading out."

Opt for fresh fuel. "Don't drive it hard until you get fresh fuel in the car," warns Ed. "Most fuel today starts to deteriorate immediately, and only has a shelf life of about two weeks." Optimal would be to locate unleaded racing fuel, which has a shelf life of about seven years. "Racing fuel is difficult to find commercially, but can be found at Pocono Race Track. Look for an octane of about 105, and safely store it in your garage for wintering your Porsche."



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
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RTR Membership

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
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
