The article which accompanied the picture indicated that the driver of the car was pronounced dead on arrival at the local hospital, and that the cause of the accident was driving too fast for conditions. The victim's car registration showed that he had bought the car within the last two weeks.

As we all know, the Porsche is an agile and responsive automobile. When we first get behind the wheel the car makes us feel like expert drivers, although most of the time this is not the case.

It takes much practice to familiarize ourselves with the car and to develop proper driving techniques: in my opinion, there is no better way to develop these driving techniques than to participate in a sprint, sprint school, or driver's school.

These events allow you to experience the automobile's limitations, as well as your own, under safe and controlled conditions. Hopefully, what you learn at a driving event will help you when adverse conditions are encountered on a public road; hopefully, it will help you keep yourself and your Porsche in one piece.

The experience of driving events may humble you initially, but you will be a better driver afterwords.







YES, YOU CAN CLIMB IT TOO, BUDDY!

> If you like autocrossing, you'll love hillclimbing; now is the time to start your planning if you really would like to give it a try.

> There are two ways to get an act together: one is to buy a prepared competition car; the other is to enter an SSS (Showroom Stock Sedan) or an SSSC (Showroom Stock Sports Car). In the first instance, know your seller. A lot of "dogs" are disposed of this way ("I can't seem to solve this overheating problemlet's sell it"). A competition car must be prepared to PHA or SCCA rules. A lot of good sports cars are available, and there is a lot more money in them than the seller is asking.

> The second way, SSS or SSSC, is less of a commitment because you can't do anything to the car that affects its performance; however, you do have to install all the safety equipment required by PHA. Furthermore, the added safety equipment would be good to have even if you decide not to continue competition. The following conditions must be met:

-roll bar or roll cage per Appendix Z of

- SCCA GCR (General Competition Rules) -3" lap belt, shoulder harness and submarine
- belt (5 or 6 point) per SCCA GCR
- -fire extinguisher
- -DOT approved tires (no racing tires)
- -headlights taped; hubcaps, jack, tools removed; spare tire retained in original position; seat backs secured; convertible tops stored, hardtops removed
- -numbers or other markings are readily removable; radios, heaters, air conditioners are permitted; adjustments are to be to the manufacturer's specifications and/or within his tolerances.
