Secondly, I would like to clarify the rules of the Riesentoter sprint series.

1. Series points will be awarded to drivers in each class as follows:

1st in class	9pts
2nd in class	6pts
3rd in class	4pts
4th in class	3pts
5th in class	2pts
6th in class	1pt

2. Points will be counted on the best two of three sprints.

3. Practice is allowed the day of the sprint prior to the first run of the day. (About 12:00 noon)

4. Classes:

A- 2.4 & 2.7 911's, All 911-S, 914-6, Carrera & Turbo Carrera

B- 2,2 & 2.0 911's except 911-S, 4 Cyl. Carrera

C- 924, 914-2.0, sc, s-90, 912 & Speedsters

D- 914-1.7 & 1.8, Other 356's not in class B or C

E- Ladies, by index (optional)

5. Cars with racing tires will have 2% added to their times

Those of you who missed our first sprint still have a shot at the series awards. If you are so inclined, I'll see you on July 10th at Xmas Village.

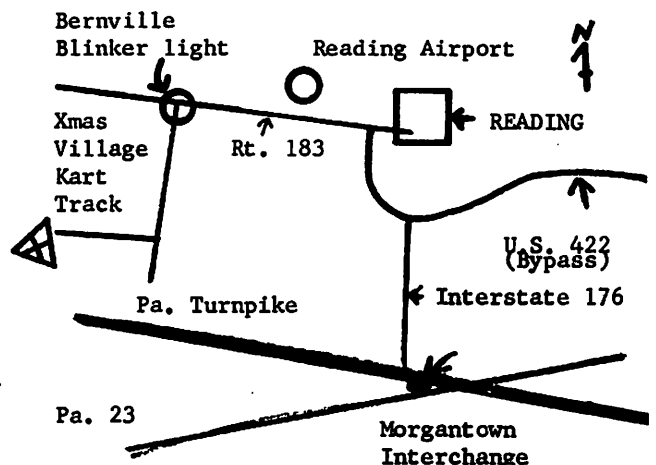

Tpk. to Morgantown exit; follow signs to Interstate 176; stay on 176 until intersection with U.S. 422 bypass west; stay on 422 around Reading, then keep a sharp eye out for Pa. Route 183 signs. Stay on 183, past the Reading Airport about 8-10 miles to the blinker light at Bernville; left at blinker, then follow signs to "Christmas Village."

The PHA season opened, therefore, at Watkins Glen on May 21 and 22, jointly sanctioned with SCCA, with a Solo I type event. Anyway, it seems that a lot of climbers got carried away in this situation where gravity was not working against them.

Meanwhile the Appalachian Sports Car Club, sponsors of the Pine Grove Hillclimb, remained undaunted with the cancellation and went about searching for another site. They have found one and, assuming that PHA gives the club a sanction to run the proposed course, it will be known as Ravine Hillclimb and will be conducted on June 18 and 19. The course is located just off Exit 32 (Ravine Exit) of Interstate 81. This is three exits north of Interstate 78.

SPORTS CAR "CORRAL" AT POCONO

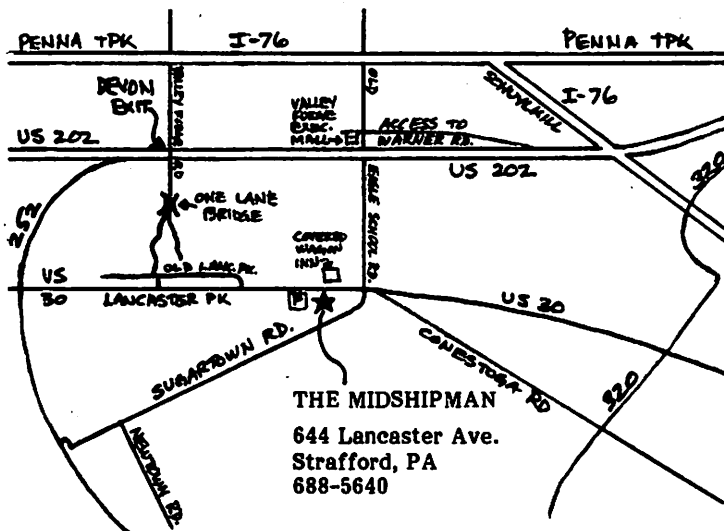
On July 24 Porsche Club members (and members of other car clubs) can participate in a one-lap parade around the racetrack.
