

For some time now, there has been talk of organizing a time trial series in the Zone 1/Zone 2 area. With the increased number of and interest in "Driver's Schools", it seems the logical thing to do.

Those of you who have heard all this flap about the driver's schools, but have yet to try one, will now be able to experience a totally new activity. Even the "long time" high speed event freaks should find the series a new challenge.

Because this will be a multi-regional series, rules and classes will be standardized providing greater incentive to travel to other regions to compete. In recent years, autocross sites have become very difficult to acquire and many competitive drivers have turned toward driver's schools and trials. Although frowned upon, participants at these schools do "put a watch" on themselves and others. So why not make it official and award trophies according to standardized classes?

Time trials generate some serious criticism from certain segments of the membership. The cost of competing in such a series can be a deterrent for some: there are travel and lodging costs, entrance fees, fuel costs, tech inspection charges, and equipment wear expenses that are far greater than autocrossing. Secondly, without a doubt, there is a higher risk of damage to the participant's car in these events. The lack of experience at high speed events discourages some people. Cost vs total track time as compared to a two-day driver's school is another concern.

However, we are trying to provide solutions to as many of the above as possible, to make these fun, safe and enjoyable events. All regions must emphasize safety as the primary consideration. The "school" part of the event will be just that - it is not considered a race! Classes are designed so a competitor does not have to spend megabucks on improvements to be competitive in stock class. Women will have their classes based on actual time with no indexing. To give most

everyone a chance at a trophy, we are proposing the "Novice Award". Also, if run efficiently, there can be track time after the second day timed laps. For those not interested in the competitive portion of these events, we will probably allow registration over and above the maximum number of series competitors. These registrants will have a reduced fee and they will participate in the "school" portion only.

Now, where are we on all this? A preliminary set of rules has been sent to Potomac, Northern New Jersey, Schattenbaum, Connecticut Valley, Metro N.Y. and Northeast Regions. So far, several have contacted me with favorable interest. We are hoping to meet January 29 to finalize rules (more on this in the next issue). Axel Shield has made great inroads and struck up a super deal with the folks at Summit Point. all. I think this thing will fly. If your interest is up, keep watching this column and come to the monthly meetings for more information. If you are not interested in competing in these events, we can always use your help. It takes a fair number of folks to do one of these successfully. Our Region is just slightly rusty at this since it has been about eight years, but remember Riesentoter pioneered these events.

On the autocross scene, there are some interesting developments. DVSA rules are being formulated and there may be major changes. Al Anderson has a real good shot at a super site and the final OK should be coming soon. If everything falls into place, there could be a full autocross season.
