By Bob Russo Riesentoter Region's Autocross Riesentoter Region's Autocross School was a rousing success. Those of you who did not come out were the losers. However, there is always next year. Over twenty hearty students braved the wind and cold to be guided through the learning stations by the instructors. As usual, several members came out only to work, some to learn and work and some to just watch. To all our instructors, instructors, workers and participants, a hearty thanks. and Hopefully those students will continue to autocross. Our first event (a Delaware Valley Sprint Association event) will tak = place at the large lot at Montgomery Mall on May 20th. Our second event originally scheduled for August 5th has been moved to August 19th to a conflict avoid with 9 Bridgehampton PATTS event, the latter having been moved from July 14th and 15th to avoid a conflict with the parade.

Speaking of PATTS, registration is going slower than we had hoped for and we have made a couple key changes which should do much to encourage participation in the series. Trophies will be awarded based on a participant's total point accumulation. There is no longer a minimum number of events that one must attend to be eligible for a trophy. Registration will remain open throughout the series.

Soon the application for the Riesentoter Region Driver School will be available. If you are planning to attend the event (37 Riesentoters did last year!), begin preparing for it early. Talk to people who attend Drivers' Schools so you will know what to expect. Make sure you and your car are correctly outfitted with safety epuipment. Have your car tech inspected and don't forget to bring the tech sheet to the track the day of the event.

There are several areas that you can practice before you attend a Drivers' School which will allow you to get the most benefit from the school. Remember you are at the Drivers' School to learn to drive smoothly around a race track. This is not the time to practice the basics of operating a car. It never ceases to amaze me, the number of people who cannot shift properly. Learn to "heel δ toe" before you come to the track. This is a basic skill necessary for smooth driving. If you are not sure of what "heel δ toe" is, do not be afraid to ask. You can practice this whenever you drive your car.

Another thing you should do is familiarize yourself with the terminology of driving. It is difficult to learn when the instructor is using words you do not understand. Learn and practice whatever is practical beforehand and the school will be more enjoyable for you and your instructor.

The purpose of this list is two-fold. First, to provide some basis of uniformity and most important of all, this list will be made available to other regions for out-of-region events. This will prevent someone from teching their own cars as well as unqualified people from performing tech.

Safety is obviously the key here. I am certain that all of us would agree that our Porsche's are very important to us and that we would not want to run an event with unsafe cars or worse still, run a track event that might include a Porsche which was not 'legal', thereby risking bodily injury or even worse - damage to our prize possessions.

The list of approved individuals and service facilities is not final. If you do not see your favorite shop on our list please let me know and the executive committee will make every effort to add them to the list.

We understand that some facilities will charge you, on a time-basis, to tech your car. Therefore we will always try to schedule a tech session before major events. As you know this is always free of charge (technical inspection only).

Tech sessions are invaluable. They give you the opportunity to do things that in the confines of your own garage would be impossible, if not totally inconvenient.

Suspension work, exhaust work, oil changes, valve adjustments, etc. can all be accomplished in a day's work. Lifts are available as

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well as factory trained mechanics to make your project successful.

Tech sessions are also necessary. If you plan to run track events or sprints, they are mandatory.

Mark your calendars now. If you need tech or just want to become more familiar with the 'mechanicals' of your car please join us.

HECKMANS MEMBERSHIP MUTTERINGS WITH APOLOGIES TO CHRIS FIELDS AMONG OTHERS



SUMMIT POINT - '84 (JULy 20,21 and 22)

Once more Porsche driving season is moving along in high gear. By the time you read this, several Riesentoters will have spent some days on various northeastern racetracks having themselves a ball. Planning is already under for Riesentoter's Driver's wav Education and PATTS Time Trials weekend at Summit Point. This year we have arranged to reat the track for three consecutive days. Friday, Saturday and Sunday, July 20th, 21st and 22nd.

The price for all three days (or any part thereof) is a verv \$65.00 reasonable driver. per Summit Point, a pretty, two mile course road with changing elevations, is a pleasant three to three and one-half hour drive from the Philadelphia area. The weekend is very social. Several caravans of Porsches leave at various times, both to and from the track. There are group dinners, as well as at the track beer blasts at the end of each day and a variety of parties among participants in and about the motels near the track. This year once again, all who mention PCA will receive a 10% discount on their motel room at the Winchester, Virginia Howard Johnsons, which our unofficial has become headquarters for this event.

Many of our new members, and those of you who have not been to a PCA track event yet, may well wonder what is a Driver's School and Time Trial. Well, a Porsche Driving School isn't exactly like high school driver's ed. It is a school designed to teach you how to drive a Porsche in the manner in which it was meant to be driven. i.e. very fast, that is faster than is legal anywhere in this land of opportunity (Mr. Reagan's 1980 campaign promises notwithstanding). Α Driver's School is a high speed event. Our school will utilize the full Summit Point track. There will be no pylons or other artificial obstacles placed anywhere on the course to slow you down. Each driver will get four runs per full track day, each run lasting approximately twenty minutes. Lap speeds for 911's average over 70 mph with a top speed of 125+ mph being reached once on every lap (just before one brakes down to about 35 mph for a 180° turn to the right).

Sound like fun? It is. But there is based upon each model's potential no reason to be frightened or speed. Then each participant is worried Porsche. This is not a racing school, but is a school to learn how to drive your Porsche quickly in a controlled and safe manner. Highly qualified PCA instructors will be on hand to explain proper driving techniques and you will be safely and progressively brought up to speed so that you will be smoothly and and be very smoothly able to drive consistently fast comfortable doing so. Once you have had this experience, you automatically become a much safer street driver. Actually, driving on a track (without on-coming traffic, cross streets, stop signs or traffic lights) is much safer than on your average highway.

After two and one-half days of instruction and practice, all the super three days at Summit Point Porsches are separated into classes in July.



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


