


We started with Friday's instructors' seminar. The weather cooperated, and all had a fine time as well as an educational experience.




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
NEW MEMBER'S NIGHT by Betsi Marsh



A DJ will provide dance music, and our dance floor will be enlarged from that of last year. Eileen and I plan to have sufficient door prizes for all party goers.






