

as Jim's wife, and our Goody Store Manager, Sharon won it last year.


Our door prizes were outstanding. Doughtery Automotive Services donated 4 four-wheel alignments, Johnston Motorsports,

# A Sact or Sictional Cale of Motor Oil By Nick Plenzick

Synthetic, partial synthetic, or good from the ground fossilized petroleum oil. Which will it be?

For many years I have read articles on motor oils and have found that they all have one thing in common: that being that they have nothing in common. One person raves about an oil; another hates it. One person says that they run lower temperatures; another says higher. One person says... well, you get the idea.

The biggest debate is between synthetic versus petroleum oils. So, should I spend \$4.00 a quart for synthetic or go down to Pep Boys and buy whatever? Well, enough theories. Here are the facts, or at least the facts as I see them.

After 20 years of racing cars and motorcycles, I have had only one oil-related failure. That was with my (and Melissa's) 924 club racer using Amsoil 20-50W synthetic racing oil. The result was a wiped-out cam and lifters. I had never had a problem before using Quaker State 20-50W racing oil nor did I have a problem after when I went back to Quaker State. The next owner of the 924 did not heed my warning about synthetics and did the same exact thing with Mobil 1.

This is not to say the synthetics do not have their place. They seem to be good in extended drain intervals since they suspend contaminants better and for cold start-ups. This is great for everyday cars, but not for my Porsches and track cars.

The best thing that you can do for your car is to change the oil frequently and to use quality motor oil. So, below is a list of cars currently in the Plenzick household with the type of oil used and the frequency of oil changes.

1974 914 2.0 liter 4 cyl. PCA Club Racer - Track Car. Driven at redline 95% of the time (the other 5% is above redline). Valvoline 20-50W racing oil. Filter and oil are changed for each track event or race.

1986 944 2.5 liter 4 cyl. Our current "vacationmobile." Valvoline 10-40W. Oil and filter every 3,000 miles or every six months.

**1972 911E Targa 2.4 liter.** Driven "sportingly" on Bucks County roads. **Valvoline 10-40W.** Oil and filter every 1,000 miles or every six months.


**1994** VW Jetta **2.0** liter **4** cyl. Melissa's everyday car. Valvoline **10-40**W semi-synthetic. Oil and filter every 6,000 miles or every six months.

1993 E-350 Ford van 7.3 liter (444 cubic Detroit inches) V-8 Diesel. Sometimes referred to as the "tank." Valvoline 10-40W semi-synthetic in winter and Valvoline 20-50W racing in the summer.

I use Valvoline primarily because it is readily available. Any of the petroleum motor oils will work just fine - if you change them frequently.

So there you have it, straight from the racers mouth or, shall we say typewriter. Twenty years without a major engine failure. I must be doing something right.

P.S. - Fellow racers take note: Since I am a firm believer and follower of Murphy's Law and, since I now have stated publicly that I have had no engine failures, I may now be due for one. Remember that when you're trying to pass me!



The Fall Rally was held on October 16 and we truly had a beautiful day with warm temperature, great colors and, at the finish line, upside down pizza.


We started as the Flying Hills Shopping Center near Reading and wove our way through three check points on our way to Picas' Restaurant in Delaware County.




