
At each breakfast a guaranteed slot in the green group at the next Drivers Education event the region is holding will be awarded to a new member attending the breakfast.

Who knew that there was such a thing as "Porsche matches"????


The annual banquet is an award night and all were given





Drivers Beware!

Cars and deer can be a lethal combination. Each year the Insurance Institute for Highway Safety reports that there are more than 1.5 million crashes in the United States involving deer, costing an estimated \$1.1 billion in vehicle damage. The average cost per insurance claim was \$2,000, with costs varying depending on the type of vehicle and severity of damage, according to the Insurance Information Institute (I.I.L.).

During deer season, which runs from October through December, there can be dramatic movements in the deer population with a significant number of deer darting onto highways and into suburban neighborhoods. Over this time period, more deer-vehicle collisions occur than any other time of year,

so drivers need to be especially cautious, warns the I.I.I. "As our wildlife habitat continues to shrink, accidents with deer and other animals are likely to increase unless we are more vigilant in our driving," said Jeanne M. Salvatore, vice president of Consumer Affairs for the I.I.I.

The I.I.I. suggests the following defensive driving tips to avoid hitting a deer: Be attentive from sunset to midnight and hours shortly before and after sunrise. These are the highest risk periods for deer-vehicle collisions to occur. Drive with caution when moving through deer-crossing zones, in areas known to have a large deer population and in areas where roads divide agricultural fields from forestland. Deer seldom run alone. If you see one deer,

others may be nearby. When driving at night, use high beam headlights when there is no oncoming traffic. The high-beams will better illuminate the eyes of deer on or near the roadway. Brake firmly when you notice a deer in or near your path, but stay in your lane. Many serious crashes occur when drivers swerve to avoid a deer and hit another vehicle or lose control of their cars.

Do not rely on devices such as deer whistles, deer fences and reflectors to deter deer. These devices have not been proven to reduce deer-vehicle collisions. Always wear your seat belt. Deervehicle collisions can result in serious injuries. People tend to underestimate how much damage collisions with animals can cause. If your vehicle strikes a deer, it's best not to touch the animal. The frightened and wounded animal could hurt you or itself, warns the I.I.I. If the deer is blocking the roadway and poses a danger to other motorists, you should call the police.

Contact your insurance agent or company representative to report any damage to your car. Collision with a deer or animals is covered under the comprehensive portion of your automobile policy. 

Americans: 7 Of Top 15 At Porsche Cup Press Release Porsche Motorsports: Bob Carlson, Andy Schupack

ATLANTA - DECEMBER 30 -

For the 35th time since its inception in 1970, the Porsche Cup was presented to the world's most successful private entry Porsche drivers at the annual Porsche motorsports dinner in Germany last week, and American racers took seven of the top 15 positions.

Craig Stanton, from Long Beach, Calif., who won the GS class in Grand-Am Cup in Nonnamaker Porsche qui and finished fifth in the GT class in the American Le Mans Series in the White Lightning/Petersen Porsche 911 GT₃ RSR, was in the running for the title all year, but finished second in the points to

Monaco's Stephane Ortelli. Stanton took home 23,000 Euros (\$27,600) for his efforts.

Ortelli was a co-driver in the last Porsche to win Le Mans overall in 1998. The 34-year-old secured the trophy after his successes competing for private racing teams in the FIA N-GT championship, the American Le Mans Series and the Le Mans 24 hour race (France).

The new Cup winner received a coveted silver-gold trophy as well as 37,000 Euros (\$44,400) in prize money. The Porsche Cup is endowed with prize money totaling 153,000 Euros (\$183,600).

Frenchman Emmanuel Collard was third in points, followed by Stanton's ALMS teammate David Murry, from Atlanta, Georgia, who finished fourth. Oth-

er Americans finishing in the top 15 among Porsche drivers worldwide included Johannes van Overbeek, from San Francisco, Calif., fifth place in the Flying Lizard Motorsports Porsche 911 GT3 RSR (ALMS): his teammate Darren Law, from Phoenix, Arizona, sixth place; The Racer's Group Porsche ALMS driver Patrick Long, from Oak Park, California, seventh; his teammate and 1999 Porsche Cup winner Cort Wagner, from Los Angeles, California, 11th; and Atlanta's Justin Jackson, in the J₃ Porsche 911 GT3 RSR, 14th.

Besides Wagner, Americans who have won the Porsche Cup previously include Price Cobb (1994), Mike Fitzgerald (2000), and Kevin Buckler (2002).


