The following letter was written by one of our members, William Gruver, when his fiancee's order for a Porsche 914 was cancelled one month before delivery.

#### Dear Dr. Porsche:

Recently my fiancee placed an order for a Porsche 914 on Tourist Delivery as stated on the attached sheet. On April 8, one month before delivery of the car in Osnabruck, we received word from our dealer that the order was cancelled. According to the local Porsche-Audi distributor there has been a production cutback at the Karmann factory due to problems with quality control which has resulted in complete suspension of the Tourist Delivery Program for this year and a delay in filling other orders.

I have been a Porsche owner and PCA member since 1965 and I can appreciate the need for effective quality control. However, the decision to suspend Tourist Delivery and cancell orders which were previously confirmed is detrimental to the reputation of Porsche-Audi and its dealers in the United States. Those of us who order through the Tourist Delivery Program have usually made extensive plans well in advance of our vacation and, in our case, the entire trip was planned around use of the 914.


My fiancee and I had originally considered purchasing the 914(with US safety standards) from a German dealer, Autohaus Glinicke GMBH in Kassel whom we contacted during our trip to Germany this past December. However, following the advice of our dealer and members of PCA we chose to place the order with John Stein Motors, who has given us very fine service during the past several years. Fortunately I was able to stop sale of my present 356 SC (after having paid for advertising, a bank loan, and found a buyer).

However, my fiancee and I are being married in Germany in mid-May and, as noted before, we have made extensive plans based on picking up the 914 in Osnabruck on May 11-13 and delivery to the port of Bremen one month later. Rental of a comparable car will now cost us over DM 2000 (DM 36 per day and 36 pf per km with Hertz or Avis) The inconvenience and cost to us is far greater than one might realize. I feel that an injustice has been committed against my fiancee, myself, and others who ordered through the Porsche-Audi Tourist Delivery Program and steps should be taken immediately to correct the situation. Furthermore, I am writing to you, Dr. Porsche, directly for reinstatement of the attached order for delivery by May 13th to Osnabruck with either John Stein Motors in Wilmington, Del. or Autohaus Glinicke GMBH in Kassel. Your attention to this letter is greatly appreciated.



#### WORDS ON WHEELS

What does Dr. Ferry Porsche have to say about the ostensibly controversial 914? Commenting on the Porsche-VW relationship in an <u>Autocar</u> interview (Jan. 29, 1970), Dr. Porsche said:

"We probably would not have acted the same way with any other Manufacturer (on use of the VW411 engine), but you should not forget that Porsche and Volkswagon have been fellow travellers for a long time. The bug is our child. An old child it is, but it comes from a fancy home! Actually, VW and Porsche belong to the same family. We have participated directly or indirectly in every existing Volkswagon....

"Last year, our output was around 15,000 units. Had we been able to make them, we could have sold 20% more. But Porsche will never go beyond the limit we have now reached. We want our cars to remain exclusive, rare. Our development will go on, but not with what we consider our own motorcars. We won't make more 911S, but we will move ahead with the 914S along with Volkswagon: 30,000 units of this new model will be built in 1970. One out of four (7,500) will be fitted with our own six-cylinder engine.

"For the same reason we don'tintend to ever make anything but sports cars. We are specialists, and we want to remain specialists...We still believe that a true sports car must have a midship engine."
