



REPORT ON WEEKEND RALLYE/SPRINT SUBMITTED BY VICKI CHATLEY:

Those of you who weren't there missed another fun filled Riesentoter weekend July 18th and 19th.

Saturday was a beautiful, sunny day; great for a rallye on the back roads of Bucks County. By 2 PM the rallyemasters, and eight entrants had assembled at the Philco-Ford parking lot. Most people chose to run the event in Porsches, but Connie and Dick arrived in a camper towing the car behind. The Howards also were towing a Porsche behind their station wagon.

Since Joanne, Jay and I had spent 6 or 7 hours setting up the rallye, we headed straight for the Holiday Inn, pausing only long enough to check out three places on the route, get some Dairy Queen, and back the Impala into a tree. Am I glad I wasn't driving!

Incidentally, setting up a rallye can be fun. John had picked out some prospective villages on the map between the starting point and the motel, and one day the children and I left sometime after noon to check them out. Unfortunately, we picked one of those humid, partly cloudy days. Was it hot and uncomfortable! We couldn't even put the top down because every so often we would run into scattered showers. Anyway, we couldn't find some of the towns John had checked, and others failed to meet our purpose. We got lost more setting up the whole thing than anyone who ran it. We found some great places that didn't appear on the map, and others which seemed to be nameless. Toward the end our original enthusiasm waned as we were hot, tired and hungry. About 7 PM I phoned John to report we were still alive and stopped on 202 south of Norristown to get a flat changed, and didn't he think pizza would be great for dinner? 

Fred Remick reported on the Giant's Despair hillclimb. The next hill will be August 8th at Topton.




