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

Dick Schuck codriving Dick Weiss's 911 was FTD after the first run of all classes on Sunday, but ended up a respectable 4th FTD behind three Corvettes in A and B Production.

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Questionnaire Results

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Last spring we distributed a questionnaire to our members in an attempt to obtain their opinions and ideas and involve as many people as possible in our events. We did not include new members in this mailing since many of the questions were related to past events. The following represents the results of that polling.

Of the 202 forms mailed 108 were returned; a remarkable

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
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53.4%! The average Riesentoter is 34.4 years old, has owned Porsches for 6.15 years, has been in PCA 4.29 years and owned 2.54 Porsches. The most common Porsche at the time of the questionnaire, was the 912 model followed closely by the 911 & 911T models, third and fourth being the 356C & 356B in that order. Surprisingly, for a relatively rare model, our region can boast 10 speedsters! Although Riesentoters are wellrepresented at parades (24.1%), attendance at the Northern New Jersey Porscherama leaves something to be desired (4.8%). Of the 71.1% who responded to the most enjoyable event, not surprisingly, the overwhelming majority favored sprinting. Rallyes, meetings and tech sessions followed in that order. The most requested event of the 45.25% who responded to the question was technical sessions followed closely by trips. picnics and rallyes.

Armed with the results of this questionnaire, we have already planned and are planning events for our region. A good example of this was our October drivers' school which eas initiated after 76% of the members polled indicated they were in favor of such an event. More social events and possibly a concours may be part of next year's calendar since positive responces for these events were 44.3% and 50% respectively. Of course, one of the reasons for a successful year last season was the abundance of help we received at our This reflects the 64.4% of our members who are events. willing to donate time to the club. This and the fact that 72.1% of the Riesentoters are interested in sponsoring a parade should make the next three years and especially 1976 some of the most interesting and exciting in the region's history.

We would like to thank all of those who took the time and effort to complete this questionnaire and we hope that the upcoming events most closely approximate the interests of our members.

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Now that the end of the year has rolled around and my job has come to an end, I would like to take the time to thank all those who contributed to the Der Gasser in one way or another





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
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
