

RADIAL RETREADS * John Phin

In these days of skyrocketing prices, it is not often that a real bargain is encountered. Many <u>Der Gasser</u> readers are aware of the advantage of radial tires and prefer to so equip their cars. But as most radials are foreign made, their price is sensitive to currency adjustments which unfortunately seem to be going against the US consumer. It is in this context that I would like to share my experience with the Technitread radial retreads.

Two years ago, when I realized the foolishness of using a 911 for daily urban transportation, I acquired a used Volkswagen fastback. This car came equipped with the cheapest US bias-ply tires imaginable. These undersized tires allowed serious oversteer and poor braking, especially in wet weather. Buying new radials could have solved those problems but such a purchase would have amounted to a large percentage of the price I paid for the car. As I had bought this car to save money, I began looking for alternatives.

When I saw the Technitread advertisement in Road and Track, I decided that the purchase of radial retreads was an acceptable gamble at such low prices. I ordered four 165x15 tires and tubes. They arrived via UPS in a short time and were mounted and balanced by a VW dealer. The total price including mailing, 2 rims, tubes and the mounting was approximately \$100.

The handling, especially braking, has been improved tremendously. These tires which appear to be an approximation of Michelin ZX treads on Semperit casings, are in balance to the VW's top speed and show negligible wear after 15,000 miles. The treads are guaranteed, pro rata for 2 years, but the cases (of course) are not. Oversteer in wet weather is still there, but not at levels that have caused me to fiddle with tire pressures. Besides, oversteer is now correctable with judicious use of the throttle, even with the VW's meagre hp.

I will make Technitread literature available at the October and November meetings. The tires (on my car) are also available for inspection or "test drive". I am completely satisfied with these radial retreads as an alternative to new inexpensive bias-ply tires or expensive radials. They do seem to be real bargains.



NEW MEETING PLACE


