


Over 3200 votes were cast nationally, and Dennis Thovson and Bob Rassa lost by margins of just 128 and 87 votes respectively. Those who won, of course, are highly qualified and will do a good job, but it would have been nice if we had at least supported those who have supported us, win or lose. Instead, only 75 votes were received from Riesentöter's large membership (Active and Family-Active members were counted as two separate voters). I am certain that our region had a higher percentage of voters than many other regions throughout the country, but we did not do enough. Please give this some thought and consider what an important role each and every one of you can play, not only at the local level, but at the national level as well. Your participation makes a big difference. Try it and you'll see.


MID-WINTER




