
MEETING SCHEDULE

HILLCLIMBING

A Hillclimb in Fairmount Park!! Fairmount Park? Yes. a hillclimb in Fairmount Park, Philadelphia is a definite possibility for the 1975 Pennsylvania Hillclimb Association Calendar. The Philadelphia Region of SCCA has proposed this possibility and has discussed it with the Park Commission. There will be another meeting with the Park Commission about mid-February to get a definite decision. If it is approved, the climb would be held in September or October. The course would be on North Georges Hill Drive. At the PHA Contest Board Annual Meeting, January 11, provisional sanction was granted pending PHA inspection of the hill and resolution of certain questions. The hillclimb would be a Solo I event as well as a PHA sanctioned event. In other actions by the Contest Board, the 1975 PHA calendar was approved:

April 26-27: Goldmine Hillclimb (provisional sanction). Site near Harrisburg--Appalachian Sports Car Club. May 17-18: Pine Grove Hillclimb, Pine Grove, Pa.--Lebanon Valley Sports and Touring Club.

June 7-8: Duryea Hillclimb, the City Park, Reading, Pa.--Blue Mountain Region, SCCA. This is the 25th running of Duryea and it will be a big event this year with the addition of a class of Vintage sports cars. These vintage cars will not run under PHA rules, but under a special vintage car club rules & regs.

July 26-27: Giant's Despair Hillclimb, Laurel Run, Pa. (near Wilkes Barre)--Northeast Pa. Region, SCCA.

August 16-17: Rose Valley Hillclimb, Trout Run, Pa. (near Williamsport)--Williamsport Sports Touring Club.

August 30-31: Pagoda Hillclimb, the City Park, Reading, Pa.--Duryea Sports Car Club.

September 13-14: Red Rock Hillclimb, Derrick City, Pa. (near Bradford, Pa.)--Allegheny Valley Sports Car Association. September 27-28: Schaefferstown Hillclimb, Schaefferstown, Pa.--Lebanon Valley Sports and Touring Club.

October 11-12: Weatherly Hillclimb, Weatherly, Pa.--Northeast Pa. Region, SCCA.

DVSA-ONE LANE BLACKTOP VORT Lyle

As most of you know, DVSA stands for Delaware Valley Sprint Association, which is composed of about eight member clubs who love to sprint their cars. Riesentoter is one of those clubs and we active sprinters (about 10-15, well, make it 6 if you leave out those without a car at present) would like to get more of you interested in this sport. Sprinting is a hell of a good time and you owe it to yourself to try it once. (In our club events this year, we are planning a low pressure Sprint School to show and tell you what it's all about.) In addition, DVSA usually has a "practice" sprint early in the year, where there are no classes, no trophies, no entry fees, just 25¢ per run and you can run as many times as your fuel supply will allow.

Talk to people like Don Reinhard, Bob and A.J. Ahrens, Erik Koch, Bob Russo, Wayne Flegler, Bob Koerbel, Bob Patton, Joe Long, and others who have been doing this for years. Or try Jim Johnson, who just started last year - his impressions might be valuable to someone else just starting this game. You certainly can't hurt anything by trying it once. You only have to go as fast as you feel comfortable and I can't remember the last time anybody blew an engine or broke anything at a sprint.

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TRI-REGION AUTOCROSS SERIES

Riesentoter Region will participate in a Tri-Region Autocross Series this year with Northern New Jersey and Schattenbaum Regions.

There will be 6 classes, plus ladies, which will be broken down as follows:

A - All 356 & 912
B - 1.7 & 1.8 914-4
C - 2.0 914-4 & 2.0 911, 911T, 911L
D - 2.0 & 2.2 911E, 2.2 & 2.4 911T, 914-6
E - 2.0, 2.2, 2.4 911S & 2.4 911E
F - Modified 4 & 6 cylinder cars, all 2.7
L - Ladies - indexed against median time in class (average of two middle times if even number of cars in class).

Drivers will be limited to one car per event, max of 2 drivers per car. A driver may not change class at an event after registering, and points are not transferable if a driver changes class between events.

The following modifications are permitted; any other modification will place the car in F:

- Ignition any modification permitted, provided the original distributor is used.
- Use ofany carb jet (no changes in venturi permitted). Air cleaners may be removed (Caution: may be a fire hazard).
- 3. Any exhaust system conforming to noise standards at the track.
- 4. Max wheel size: $5\frac{1}{2}$ "; for 911: 6".
- 5. Any non-racing tire that fits without exterior body modification.
- 6. Any shock absorber or sway bar, but only stock springs or torsion bars permitted.
- 7. Any spciler.
- 8. Any oil ccoler.

Pylons will be two (2) seconds each.




