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

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
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PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

My father thought it was loud and ugly. My mother almost killed herself trying to back down the drive with a Ford truck clutch and extra heavy springs. But I loved it.

Well, the Ford (or "Blue Brick" as it was affectionately referred to by my friends) went the way of all hard driven cars and **1** progressed through a number of pieces of American iron. Then It Happened.

A friend told me about a 1953 MGTD. Some guy had taken it apart for Restoration, and had never put back together. I stole it for \$175 and had an instant project. I was hooked. Never again would I drive a Detroit Special. After two years the T.D. was sold to a '61 Austin Healy "Bug Eye" Sprite. That would start most of the time; the T.D. would not.

Now to shorten this nostalgic trip. I started going to ralleys and other sports car events and the car that always was the center of attraction was the one with the engine in the wrong place- a PORSCHE -I vowed then, if I ever got the money, I would own a brandy-new Porsche-and in January of 1965 I did it. For \$6244 and my soul in hock to the bank, I ordered a '69 Porsche Targa 912.....





TECH TIP

CLUTCH CABLES

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If your Porsche ever breaks a clutch cable you'll know the feeling; it's one you want to avoid. Recently, I found out and immediately started my (almost) shiftless return trip home from center city Philadelphia. You might be surprised, but by easing the gearshift lever out of gear and coasting when approaching red lights and by restarting the car from a dead stop with the transmission in second gear, the problem can seem only a minor bother. Obviously, though, this practice is not recommended except for emergency use, so this article is intended to help others avoid this predicament.

Next time your car is on a lift, or with two wheels safely up on a curb, check your cable, housing and fittings at the clutch for free movement (no binding) and condition. This takes two people: one repeatedly depressing the clutch pedal and one underneath inspecting. You can easily inspect the cable up front by folding back the carpet or mat and peering through the hole in the tunnel. Should you find weak spots on the cable or any fittings my advice is to replace it, thereby eliminating causes of cable failure.


When the cable broke on my 1971 911 I found that the real problem was not that the cable snapped in half, but that a \$1.55 nylon cable guide (Porsche part number 911.423.212.00 - "link") lost the flanges that actuate the clutch throw out fork. Earlier inspection probably would have revealed this problem.

The method for replacement of the nylon link, a part peculiar to '70-'71 911's, is:

- 1. Release the cable from the front with the shackle type fixture still attached by unsnapping the spring on the shackle and removing the throw pin from the padal shaft.
- 2. From underneath pull the cable towards the rear slowly until you can release the stop (Porsche part number 911.423.213.00 - "nipple") from the "ear" on the transmission housing.

- 3. Remove the boot (Porsche part number 914.423.922.02 - "sleeve") from the rear of the cable: cut it off if necessary.
- 4. Remove the nylon"link" and replece. Make sure fit the protroing flanges of the nylon a onto the clutch throw out fork.
- 5. Replece undamage sleeve (\$.95) and nipple and reinsert nipple into the transmission housing "ear."
- 6. Reconnect the cable up front with the shackle and pin fitting. You may need help from someone to hold the lutch pedal all the way UP while you place the pin through the shackle and pedal shaft.

This procedure is really quite simple and shouldn't take more than one hour the first time you do it.

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
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
