

Having been a member of Riesentoter Region of P.C.A. for the past six years I recently stopped to reflect as to why I joined and more importantly, why I have stayed active.





AIR POLLUTION

The entire nation has been stampeded into a massive, multi-billion-dollar program to reduce the three major auto pollutants -- hydrocarbons, oxides of nitrogen and carbon monoxide. But scientists are just now finding that about 94% of the total world production of these pollutants actually come from nature.

Neither the auto companies nor the pollution scientists are yet saying that the government's control program is a gigantic mistake. The automotive-type pollution is concentrated in the metropolitan areas where the people and the cars are. This is especially true of carbon monoxide.

However, the growing awareness of the vast volumes of naturally-produced automotive-type emissions has sent some tremors through the pollution-control establishment. In contrast to the feeling that carbon monoxide, if it is a problem, is definitely related to cars, there are growing suspicions that the other auto-related pollution problem, photochemical smog or oxidant, could very well be caused in large measure by the natural sources.

An important fact about this situation is that many researchers both in and out of government are now finding large quantities of the oxidants in rural areas and remote areas, far from the large cities and their car concentrations.







