
My brown, 356, car should be on the road by the end of March, for those who are interested. I have had much help from many in the club, actual and moral and both are appreciated.



HILLCLIMBING JESS HOLSHOUSER

The PHA Annual Meeting and Trophy Awards Banquet was held January 31 at Danville. At the Annual Business meeting, dates for the 1976 calendar were set, with the sanctioning of all requested hillclimbs. Sanctions were given to only four hillclimbs so far. They were:

April 24-25 Goldmine Hillclimb Appalachian Sports Car Club May 15-16 Pine Grove Hillclimb Lebanon Valley Sports and Touring Club August 21-22 Pagoda Hillclimb Duryea Sports Car Club September 18-19 Red Rock Hillclimb Allegheny Valley Sports Car Association

Two other possibilities exist. Lebanon Valley is looking for a site to replace Schaefferstown and Appalachian is looking for a second hill to be run in the fall. We were all disappointed that the Blue Mountain SCCA did not ask for PHA sanction for Duryea Hillclimb, nor did Northeast Pennsylvania request sanction for Giant's Despair or Weatherly. Relations have been somewhat strained recently between those two groups and PHA, and this year they chose to go it alone. If they run these hills without PHA sanction, they will be Solo I events only and thus will not count toward the PHA season points.

Of interest to PHA and SCCA drivers is that the Glen Region SCCA plans to conduct two Solo I events at the Glen this year. Dates are not definite, but have been announced as May 22-23 and June 26-27. PHA is attempting to arrange for a PHA drivers school to be held May 22 in conjunction with the May 22-23 Solo I. For novice drivers, the school would count for two novice hillclimbs toward a senior license.

The Central Pennsylvania Region of PCA has applied for and received associate membership in PHA. They will be fielding at least one six driver team to compete with us in the team championship competition.

The PHA officers elected for 1976 were announced. They are Ron Spangler-President; Dick Sweigart-Vice President; Sue McIntyre-Secretary-Treasurer.

Priscilla Newpher will continue as the Executive Secretary by action of the PHA Contest Board. For those of you who need novice applications or have other business with PHA, the PHA address is the same as last year: Pennsylvania Hillclimb Association; P.O. Box 333, Montoursville, PA 17754.

The PHA 1975 Yearbook is a little late this year, but should be in the mail by the time you read this. Also, the 1976 Rulebook should be published by mid-March.





In case you don't know, a tech session is an informal work session where you can take your Porsche into a nice warm dealer's shop and do just about whatever you want to do to it for several hours. There are refreshments, the parts department is open for business, and there are experts around to assist you. The cost? A mere dollar to use the lift (it goes to PCA, not Holbert's) and you get it back if you stay to clean up after. In addition, there is usually a lecture on something of a technical nature. This time it's 911 fuel injection, but the tech session is open to all Porsches. Look to your left (page 12) for details.

And while we're on tech stuff, there are now three new tech people, one for each kind of Porsche. (If you drive a 912, see Dennis for body/suspension items, and Vern or Joe for appropriate engine items.) Their phone numbers are on page 3.

That means Driver determination VS. Asphalt and if you don't believe it ask the guys who ran in A Stock. There were five of them last year who ran within hundredths and often thousandths of a second of each other. The cars are actually quite different models and with distinctly different potential -- on paper anyway. The point is that determination to win can often overcome a "faster" car. I don't know which car is "superiorly" equipped (racer's secrets, you know), but it doesn't seem to matter. Ask any of them -- Bob Ahrens, Joe Long, Mel Feldman, Paul Cuppett and Don Reinhard--these guys are super competitive and just have a ball at sprinting. If you are perhaps worried about "racing"your precious Porsche--not to worry, that's what it was designed to do--ask the guy who runs one.

On to the coming season--if you need a copy of the rules of schedule, call me or see me at the meeting. (Ed. note: The 1976 DVSA Schedule appears on page 17.) Just briefly, here are the rules changes: 1) Two drivers per car per class for points and trophies will be allowed. 2) "Slick" radials OK for modified class if in good condition otherwise. 3) Running gear may be changed between models of the same car of the same year, if both are in the same class; and in Stock classes, pollution gear need not be operating, air cleaners are not required, and velocity stacks will be permitted.

The class changes as they affect Porsches: in A Stock, stpaight 2.0 litre 911 moved down to B Stock. In B Stock, two fast cars were moved up from C Stock, the BMW 2002 and those real quick Alfas. Look out, B Stockers. (That; s good news for our guys in C Stock, though.) A whole bunch of stuff that used to be in D Stock got moved up to C, but I don't see anythink to worry about. Don't hold me to that if somebody blows your doors off.

The Modified classes were changed so that the fastest cars would be in the top lettered classes. All A Stock Porsches stay in A Mod. The new B Mod is the same as the old <u>C Mod</u> (no Porsches). **A**11 mcdified Porsches in <u>B & C Stock</u> now run in <u>C Mod</u>, but against pretty much the same cars as before.

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From the Schuylkill Expressway (Route 76) take King of Prussia Exit, Route 202 North. Proceed 1.7 miles on Route 202 North to Henderson Road. Turn right, travel .7 mile to Church Road (across second set of railroad tracks). Turn right on Church Road. NTW is 1 block on the right.
