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



PORSCHES GO RACING

In May, many of us got to see some good racing at the SCCA Trans Am Race at Pocono and the IMSA Race at Lime Rock, Connecticut. Among the drivers at Pocono were Al Holbert (Turbo) and Mike Tillson (911T), both members of Riesentoter and both recent guest speakers at our meetings. Al ran a Monza at Lime Rock.

As a pit crew worker for Mike's #72 car (usually #92. but someone else had that n mber this time), I got to see the race from pit wall. It was Porsche Turbos all the way. Although Al diced with Hurley Haywood and George Follmer all through the race. those three never dropped below third. Meanwhile, Mike, who started 27th grid position in a field of 40 cars, steadily worked his way up to 17th place. There were no pit stops by either Riesentoter in the 100 mile race, so all I had to do was sit there and watch the action. At the finish, Hurley Haywood was only a few feet ahead of Al and George Follmer, who had dropped back a good bit while still maintaining third place, played a good game of catch up and finisned only a few feet behind Α].

Lime Rock was a whole different story. As you may know, IMSA has banned the Turbo because they were afraid Porsche would continue to dominate the series as they have all along. So, Al Holbert went there in a Chevrolet Monza.

It was Mike Keyser, former Porsche driver, in a Monza, Al in his Monza, and Peter (Perfect) Gregg in a BMW leading the pack for the first part of the race. Then Peter spun the BMW onto the grass, barely 100 feet from where he spun the Porsche a year ago, got going again, but soon pulled into the pits with some sort of mechanical failure. This let the Porsche of George Dyer into third place, a good half lap behind the Monzas. Up to the halfway point, the lead Monzas were only a few feet apart, but on lap # 33 (of 66 laps), Mike Keyser came past, but no Al Holbert. It seems Al lost it at West Bend and was cut of the race.


Could a Porsche possibly make up over half a lap in only 35 more? It meant gaining over a second a lap on the Monza! Around and around and around they went, each lap George Dyer's Porsche getting a little closer to the white # 1 Monza of Mike Keyser. George Dyer was gaining that needed one second a lap on the Monza, and in a story-book finish, the little blue Porsche passed the Monza on the very last lap to take the checkered flag just ahead of it.

Yes, it was true, Porsche could still win at IMSA racing, even without the Turbos, against the threat of the big engined Detroit cars (remember, folks, Riesentoter means "Giant Killer").

Incidently, the Program they were selling at Lime Rock ran an article entitled "Calling a Halt to the Porsche Parade." The Program said, "The record of Porsche domination at Lime Rock is total: since the Camel GT Traveling Road Show first stopped at LRP in 1972, Porsche hasn't been bested." Today, that statement is still true.

Then it went on to say, "But all of that is history: is 1976 the end of the road for Porsche?" Try as IMSA may, with their bans on the Turbos, I feel Porsches will still win races for many years to come. Maybe IMSA will have better luck with the Camel GT Challenge Series than SCCA had with the Can-Am Series after they banned the turbocharged Porsche 917's in an effort to tempt the competition to enter and end the domination by one marque. (Funny, there were no bans throughout all the years of McLaren domination.) Maybe the new All American GT Class is just what Porsche needs to stimulate them to build even better racing cars -- after all, Porsches are improving all the time.


