

#### HOW'S YOUR SYNCH?

Just a short note concerning your carburetors. We all know that the manuals advise checking the carb synchronization every so often, but most people tend to put it off. "The engine runs OK, why should I bother?" That's a good enough philosophy, but it can run so much better when properly tuned!

Carb synch is really linkage synch. The throttle gets sloppy with age, gets bent with hard romps on the loud pedal, loses its setting due to vibrations, etc. I used to check mine every 3,000 miles and it always required resetting. That got me thinking that at some point prior to 3,000 miles, things weren't right. I've started checking every 1,000 miles and you wouldn't believe how far off the synch can be.

The results of correcting a synchronization problem are immediately apparent in smoother running, quicker throttle response and yes, even better mileage. So spend a little time with your Unisyn or if you're in the dark on this, come on out to the next Tech Session\* and we'll go over everything you need to know.

#### Riesentöter Region Takes Team Fourth Place

Yes Porsche-Pushers, our hillclimb team representing our club finished strong to take 4th place in the run for the Team Championship Trophy in the 1976 series of the Pennsylvania Hillclimb Association. It was a surprise to us since we had been about seventh place for most of the year. The new entry in the team competition, Team Bergmeisters of the Central Pa. Region of PCA, finished 5th.

In the Modified 2 class, Dennis Frick of the Central Pa. Region of PCA finished 1st and his co-driver Eric Wagner finished 3rd. They were driving a Royale Porsche. Tom Beil, who did not run many hills this year, finished 5th.

In the EP2 class, consisting of Porsches (356's), Triumphs (TR-3's and TR-4's) and Alfa Romeos, first place was tied between John Dohner (in an Alfa Romeo) and Lorne Fritz (in a TR-3B). In the unusual way PHA designates the finishes, Marc Gerstein (in a TR-3B) and Jess Holshouser (in a Speedster) finished in a tie for 2nd.

For the fastest-time-of-day trophy, Ted Klaus finished 5th behind Dennis Frick. Tom Beil was 7th and Dave Derecola 8th in the FTD run.

Dick Sweigert and I attended the PHA Pre-annual meeting on November 20 to vote on rules changes for 1977. There are no major changes. The changes will be summarized in a newsletter to drivers to be mailed soon. The official Rules and Regs book, however, will not be published until after the PHA annual meeting and banquet to be held February 5, 1977 at the Sheraton in Reading, Pa. At that time, we will vote on final rules changes and sanction the events for 1977. At this time there are eight events firm with a possibility of one or two additional hills. In addition, there will be a PHA Drivers School to be held at Watkins Glen on May 21, with a Solo 1 event there on May 22.
