Skiing at Jack Frost or Big Boulder

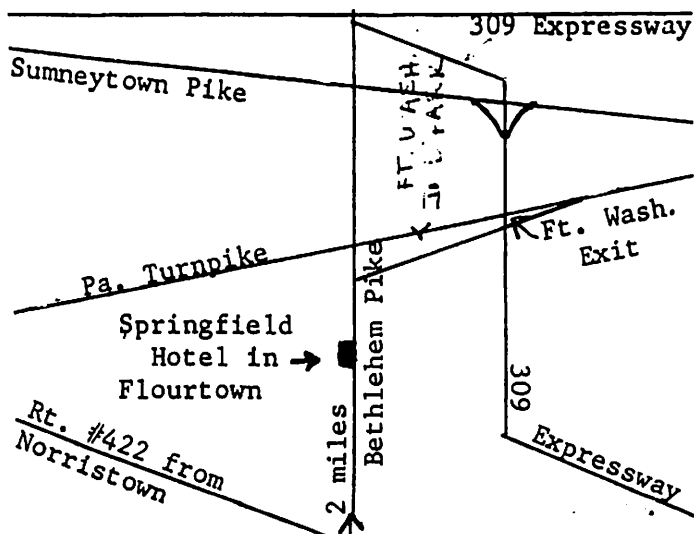
Ice skate, Toboggan, Sled, or snowmobile at Split Rock.
