



Our last few articles have talked about autocrosses, hillclimbs and drivers' schools. There are, however, two other competitive events which bear mention -- concours and rallies.

This month we'll discuss the former. A concours, officially Concours D'Elegance, usually elicits groans, wailing and the gnashing of teeth from those who have attempted it. By its very nature it is trying and frustrating.

What exactly is a concours and why do people participate in them? Loosely translated, Concours D'Elegance means a showing of beauty or elegance. Only the French could apply such a romantic name to such a masochistic sport (well, for some, romance and masochism go hand in hand, so to speak). All kidding aside, concours is a most demanding sport. The object is to determine which car, in the judges' eyes, is the most meticulously prepared. To make this decision, the judges scrutinize every surface, nook, cranny, and component of the competing cars, finally arriving at the winner. Invariably, that car belongs to someone else!! The difficult thing about competing in a concours is that you don't know where the judges are going to look and what guidelines they will use. Porsche Parade concours for example, are historically bathed in originality. Any car which may be considered altered from original, or a FRAUD will not do well. Other events, such as the New Hope Auto Show, are not so much concerned with how original, but how wellprepared a particular car is. The biggest criticism of concours is the fact that it is subjective. Supposedly, things such as color, chrome, ride height, accessories, etc. have no effect on scoring ... well-1-1-1.

After many years as concours competitors, we have developed a sure-fire way to enjoy participating in one of these events. First, learn to pronounce certain words. This helps win over the judges. Always, I repeat, always say "Por-sha"; never, repeat, never say concours (silent "s" -- French; n'est pas?). When you say "dirt" or "grease" either look sorrowfully toward heaven for forgiveness, or look forlornly


downcast in guilt. Secondly, go into the competition with the right attitude, enter for the fun of it. Don't expect to win--there's always some nut who has absolutely nothing better to do than clean his car. You cannot compete against this type of individual. Your attitude should be that your car is cleaner than when you started, therefore, there is less dirt which means less weight, which means quicker autocross times (and that's what it's all about anyway isn't it?). If you are attending a multi-event weekend, the Concours is entered only to qualify for overall scoring. Your strategy should be to do fair in the concours and blow their doors off in the autocross. If it's a Parade Concours you have no reason to participate other than total insanity, threats to kill your first born if you don't enter, or severe masochistic tendencies requiring psychiatric help.

But, always remember the statement by the old philosopher, Baron Von Krylon, "Nobody loses a concours because everyone ends up with a clean car."


By the way, we still do not have a site for our events.



Shine 'n Speed

As most everyone should know by now, Riesentoter and Potomac Regions are jointly hosting a combination Track, Social and Concours weekend on and around Summit Point Raceway, the weekend of July 17-18.

The "low key" Concours starts at 2:00pm Saturday at the Bavarian Inn, overlooking the Potomac River. Car washing facilities available at the site. The Inn is highly recommended for both its food and atmosphere - lodging is in alpine motif chalets. It is located in Shepherdstown, the oldest town in West Virginia, about 15 minutes from the track. The trip from Philadelphia takes about 3-4 hours, so if you leave by 9:00am you should have plenty of time to clean your car and have lunch beforehand.

Dinner at the Inn is to be a gathering of Porsche nuts and starts at 7:30pm. Prior to dinner you can relieve the thirst of a hard day at the Inn's Rathskeller. And though you must make your own reservations for dinner (304-876-2551), all Porsche people will be seated together. Make reservations as early as possible!

After dinner, plan to get a good nights sleep because you will want to be at your very sharpest Sunday on the track. The track is being resurfaced this month and new curbing at each apex was already installed when we were there in April. Grid tech for all cars 7 to 8:00am at the track, along with free coffee and donuts. Free beer after the event, courtesy of Electrodyne.

If you have not been to a track event, THIS IS THE EVENT FOR YOU. Not only will you be doing what you always promised yourself you would do someday - drive your car as it was designed to be driven - but you will also be supporting your Region and Zone 2 by doing so. Join the fun, you won't regret it. All of us will have a better time if you are there.


