
LAST CALL FOR OUR WINE TASTING PARTY by Tony & Eileen Checkowski

Al Holbert addressed a standing room only crowd of 133 members of Riesentöter Region at the regular March gathering of the club. Yours truly held off a riotous assembly of macebearers by dragging out a rather thin business meeting while we waited for Al to arrive from a press conference in New Jersey. Thankfully, he arrived on time, that is just after I perspired away 32 pounds. Meanwhile, Richard van Zijl, my able associate lingered in the relative sanctuary at the rear of the room, ready to bolt for the stairs if the need arose.

Holbert's remarks covered the full gamut of current Porsche subjects including his recent experiences at Sebring, the future of the 962, Porsche and the Indianapolis 500, Porsche and Formula I, his intentions with respect to racing, Porsche Cars North America, the possible reintroduction of the 930 to the U.S., new projects for the American market, and several other subjects. Competition Chairman Al Anderson has secured the parking lot of the LuLu Temple on Butler Pike in Plymouth Meeting for our Autocross School on April 28th. The school will begin at 9:30am. The organizers of this event are planning instruction and practice in such areas as threshold braking, slalom, skid pad, and more. The second half of the school will give the participants the opportunity to drive several times through an actual autocross course. This will be preceded by a walk of the course with our expert instructors. Autocrossing, and especially an autocross school, is an excellent way to ease yourself into precision driving. For those of you who already have it mastered, it is a chance to stretch your legs (or you may prefer to drive) and polish your skills before a busy driving season. Our instructors will begin their search for 1985's ultimate recipient of the famed William

C. Schmidt Broken Crankshaft Award which is awarded to the novice Riesentöter autocrosser who is most improved during the season.

There will be a \$5.00 charge per driver which will include as many timed fun runs around the course that you would like and that time will allow. Half of the event proceeds will be donated to a charity to benefit crippled children. If we are lucky, we might even get to see my wife Jane behind the wheel of her 944. Call any member of the Executive Commettee if you have questions. Bring a picnic lunch. (I like chicken.)



There are now 440 members in our club, and many of you new Riesentöters have expressed an interest in competiton.

Now is the time for you to discover the reason our cars were built in the first place: they handle well, and they go like stink. If you haven't experienced the thrill of driving one of the many road courses we use for our track events, then now is the time. Come to a track event and drive your car at your own pace. We have instructors who will teach you the proper lines of the track, proper breaking, and basic techniques of driving your car smoothly. If you have the urge to compete, enter one of the time trials, or get even more serious and enter the PATTS series. Remember, Driver's Schools are educational; they are a learning experience that you can carry over to your daily driving. Or you can progress to a more advanced racing series. We have some drivers who also participate in the Skip Barber Series.

Our Autocross program is also a way to test your driving skills. Your ability to accelerate, break, and corner become critical in a much smaller environment. We are starting this season with an Autocross School on April 28. Some of the best instructors around will be at your disposal to help you understand your car and your driving abilities. The skills involved in Autocrossing are immense, and they can help improve you high speed driving abilities.

We have some excellent Autocrossers in Riesentöter. And if you don't think being smooth is important, catch the Vern & Melody Lyle Act at our next Autocross; they wrote the book on smoothness. Vern is also one of our instructors. Or catch the Bob & Dodie Russo Show at an autocross and/or high speed track event. My point being, the skills and challenges are there, high speed Driver's Schools or Autocrosses.

The season is off and running. Get your car ready, and go for it. Support you club.




