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

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RIESENTÖTER COUPLE RUNS <u>ANNACAN</u> 1985 by Jim & Jan Jandrlich

ANNACAN '85 took place as scheduled on April 27th.(see 03/85 <u>Der Gasser</u> -ed.) Jim and I spent the night before in Annapolis so we could find the starting point of the race, determine how to get out of Annapolis, and be well rested for the start the next day.

The following morning people milled around checking out the various "bear" equipment which included radar detectors and CB radios. One driver even had a movie camera mounted inside his car. There were a lot of war stories exchanged, but everyone was mum about the route they had plan-

ned to Niagara Falls.

There were entrants form Ohio, New Jersey, Pennsylvania, Maryland, Virginia, Tennesee, and Florida. The field included 5 Porsches: a 944; 928; 911T Targa; and 2 924s. There were 1 Corvette, 1 BMW, and various other types of cars including a beat-up green '65 Nova.

Last years's winner was there with a red Honda Civic. He said he planned to use the same route as last year and had made 5 practice runs to reduce his time from the winning 6 hrs 43 min.

to 6 hrs. 30 min. He hoped that his knowledge of the route would make up for his lack of speed that some of the other cars had.

We planned a direct route that included 150 miles of two lane highway, and it was difficult determining if we should take our Porsche for power or the BMW to be as inconspicuous as possible. Because of the speeds we anticipated running, the BMW won out. Our Porsche seems to attract bears and other drivers who want to race. This trip was no time to attract attention!

The first car was off at 7:30am, and we were number 5 at 7:42. It was a beautiful drive up, and rather uneventful until we reached the 2 lane highway. There were many slow driving Sightseers. Our frustration increased when we were passed by the 928 that had started after us. He had the power required to get around those slow drivers, and it was at that point we wished we were in our Porsche so we could blast by the slow drivers too. We had the 928 in sight for a few miles, but it soon disappeared in the distance.

We were on the last leg of our trip, 40 miles from Buffalo, when Jim noticed a car closing in on us fast. With the binoculars, I was able to determine that it was last year's winner in his red Honda. It didn't take long for him to blast by us and wave wildly knowing that he was making excellent time.

On the other side of Buffalo, we got stuck at a toll bridge that was bogged down with construction. The only con-

solation was that everyone had to cross this bridge. However, some toll booths were faster than others.

We finally made it through with the next and last stop Goat Island. The finishing crew welcomed us at the finish line and gave us our time of 6 hrs 39 mins. which ultimately put us 5th among 19 cars. Some of the other

The 911 T broke down and did not finish the race.

That evening we all met at a nearby restaurant for drinks and dinner. the awards were presented and stories told about speeding tickets received and almost received.

It was a fun weekend! We saw some great scenery and met some nice people, some of whom we expect to see next year when we'll race hopefully to win, in our Porsche!



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
