





PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE by Michael Stolper

Jane and I are in New Hampshire recuperating from the driver' school at Summit Point and our recent club meeting at Rosemont Porsche + Audi at which 83 members inspected 10 rare and unusual Porsches, past and present and listened to Bob Russo's well oiled litany about the cars and their characteristics. We saw Norm Robinson's '54 356 Cabriolet, Skip and Lee Ellen Chalfont's Speedster, Sandy Sadtler's '59 RSK, Allen Friedman's '60 356 B Roadster, Halsey and Trophy Frederick's '73 911 Carrera RS, John and Jill Heckman's '76 912E, Bob Holland's '76 Turbo Carrera, Ken Magistrate's '81 924 Turbo, Al Anderson's '83 944/924 Carrera Replica, and Jim Levitt's '85 Carrera Turbo-look Targa. The club served beer and soda, and if you did not attend we missed you.

Riesentöter has mastered the art of running good driver's schools. Our Rajah, Axel Shield, taught us well and left his legacy when he retired his post last year. As with our autocross schools, the driver's school maximized track time by adhering to a strict schedule. Most drivers managed to get over 2 hours of track time per day. On Sunday, the third day of the event, we squeezed 90 drivers through the time trial in only 5 hours, despite several cases of heat prostration. 41 of the 131 participants were members of Riesentöter.

The organizers and helpers at our event gave tirelessly of themselves throughout the weekend. Some of them did not even drive the event. Were they deranged, simpletons, possessed or religious zealots? I think not (although it has been said that I can have these effects on people.) To Al (Prometheus-unbound) Anderson, the event organizer, and his kindred souls, we all give thanks.

The club van, powered by blood, sweat, and tears, successfully completed the journey to and from West Virginia. It will serve as mission control at our Sunday, July 21 autocross which was advertised in last month's <u>Der Gasser</u>. The autocross is a trophy event, and the trophies are handsome, and I want one. By the time you read this, the event will most likely be history. However, I'm sure that we will have had a typically excellent Riesentöter time. Watch future issues of <u>Der Gasser</u> for future events.

It's amazing what a difference a month can make! Just last month I was bemoaning the fact that new member activity was unusually slow. This month new and potential R.T.R. members are coming out of the woodwork. This month alone we have acquired 13 new members with an additional 15 people requesting information about our club. I don't know to what this vertiable bonanza may be attributed. However, I do know that many of you members-in-goodstanding corral innocent, unsuspecting Porsche owners on the street and give them the old Riesentöter sales pitch - a very successful method of recruitment I might add, judging from the feedback I get from the new members.

So, to those of you who are extolling the virtues of Riesentöter far and wide, a well deserved salute, and to our new members, a hearty welcome!

If you'll bring your main course,


the club will supply cold beer and soda, and pretzels and chips. Likewise, we'll get the coals hot, for the Camp's supplied charcoal pits and condiments.


