

Nominations from the floor will be accepted through the close of business at the September meeting. The elections will be held at the OKTOBERFEST on November 1.










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TECH SESSION by Don Galbraith



SOME THOUGHTS ON BRAKE FLUID by Bob Patton

You may have wondered why we recommend changing brake fluid often, and requiring it be changed within 3 months before a track event (except for Silicone fluids). Brake fluid, that is the DOT 3 type, contains very long chain alcohols, and boils at over 500 degrees F. However, as time passes, it tends to absorb water from wherever possible. Even small amounts of water can drastically reduce the boiling point. On hard use, as at a track event, the absorbed water boils out into small steam pockets. When the pedal is applied, the steam pockets compress, giving the pedal a spongy feel as though there is air in the lines. This can be quite unnerving (not to mention dangerous) when going into a turn at 90 mph.

But that's not the only reason to keep the brake fluid bled. After absorbing water, brake fluid becomes quite corrosive to metal — namely wheel and master cylinders. This can cause the calipers to bind, which increases brake pad wear and reduces both performance and gas mileage. Eventually, the calipers may need to be rebuilt.

Silicone fluid, on the other hand, does not absorb water, so the boiling point does not decrease with age. It is also Therefore, it does not renon-corrosive. quire periodic bleeding. Unfortunately, Silicone brake fluid is not compatible with the alcohol type, and the two will not mix. Since your Porsche left the factory with the alcohol type fluid, and not Silicone, changing over will require a complete flushing of the system to remove all traces of the old. This is not an easy task, and will require bleeding quite a bit of the expensive Silicone fluid out of the system to carry out the last of the alcohol type. However, a lot of work and expense up front can save a lot of work and expense in the future. The choice is yours.

CAR TELEPHONES by Bill O'Connell

As most are aware, car phones have finally reached a point where many of us can justify one, but the thought of a bunch of holes in our cars perhaps leaves us cold. Through persistence, I was able to overcome the problem and, in the process, gain more flexibility. The purpose of this article is to save you some of the grief and aggravation I encountered.

I decided that a portable unit of some sort was the answer to the no hole problem. Armed with this decision, I started looking for someone to supply the unit I needed. The official ALEX portable looked good, but I found the unit to be underpowered (I use it on the fringe areas quite a bit). Plus there is a hefty premium on it. I ended up designing a briefcase model which can be moved between my vehicles in 3 to 5 minutes and not take up a seat -- a serious consideration in a Porsche. Each of my vehicles is hard wired for power; the 944 has a glass mounted antenna, the Mazda has a roof mount, and the Mercedes uses a magnetic mount. The magnetic mount and a "Y" connector cigarette cord allows me to use the car telephone (and my Escort) in a rental car with ease.
