
MEETINGS FOR 1987 by Bill O'Connell

As I sit here in 27 inches of snow it is hard to believe that spring is around the corner, but I know in my heart that it is. As such, it is time to think of getting your Porsche in tip top shape, not to mention cleaning up the poor beater that took the brunt of the salt this winter. With this in mind, we are having the meeting at California Detailing, a firm that specializes in making your car sparkle like the ones in the car ads. They will show us step by step how to perform magic.

There is one hitch to this. Parking is limited and is mostly on street so please heed the following advice: 1) Group up where possible to cut down on the number of cars. 2) Leave your Porsche at home and bring your 2nd car - Al's fines are suspended for the night. DIRECTIONS: Schuylkill Expressway to Belmont exit. Turn left (or right if you were going west on the Expressway) and cross over the river. 
# SPRING SOCIAL



# SCCA Solo I News

As you may know, Bill O'Connell ran Duryea Hillclimb last year and I think he is hooked. He'll be back and Al Anderson is showing interest. There just may be others out there who would like to give it a try. The schedule for this year is still tentative but it shouldn't move around that much. The final dates will be set within a month from this writing. There are plans for 4 hillclimbs and possibly as many as 2 flat-track Solo I events (Pocono and Summit Point) in the Northeast Division of the SCCA this year.



In addition, in the Southeast Division of SCCA, there are two Solo I hillclimbs to be run in Western North Carolina. These are the Chimney Rock Hillclimb, April 25 and 26 and Grandfather Hillclimb, September 19 and 20. There is a small migration of drivers from our area to one or both of these since they usually fit neatly into the schedule.

Car preparation for safety and driver outfitting are essentially the same as if you were going road racing. Drivers must wear the full suits of fire resistant material over approved underwear, have a '75 or later Snell approved helmet ('85 recommended & '80 required for Special Solo I events) and have shoes, socks and gloves of approved material. The cars must have roll bars and in some cases, roll cages, 5 or 6 point driver restraint on-board systems and fire Those of you who extinguishers. are interested can get all the details in the just published 1987 editions of Solo I and II rules, the General Competition (GCR) Rules and the appropriate car speci-fication requirements applicable to the four-wheeler you would like to run. Let's make this a great season by attending the events and developing the skills necessary to defeat those Corvettes at the end of the year.


