




## Autocross 89




## **Upcoming Social Events**

Autocross date change: note that the October 15 date has been changed to the 29th. This is 90% certain at presstime, so check the next issue of DER GASSER for any update.

New Car Previews: All the 1990 Porsches will have anti-lock brakes, and airbags for driver and passenger. A 3.0 liter 208-hp 944 S2 Cabriolet has been added; 3.3 liter 282-hp 911 Turbo no longer available, all Carrera 2 will have 3.6 liter 247-hp motors, with an optional Double Function trans, allowing full automatic or full manual shifting. The 928 gets a 326-hp rating, 7 and 9.5" wheels shift for stick models, and Subject to change, limited slip. as they say.

Porsche/Corvette Challenge news; well, on that day anyway. You probably were not aware that you were also in open competition with anyone else who happened to show up and you may have received in the mail indicating results that you won a trophy. They will probably mail them to you. When I those results and looked at noticed several Porsches listed in the wrong class, I didn't look any further. But, how could they know what classes we were in, they never asked, and we're not even sure what system they used. SCCA probably, but who knows? ## **A Diabolical Invention**

I have not been to a drag race for thirty years. And the idea of attending and participating in one now was somewhat intriguing and amusing. Actually, I really felt that I had outgrown such nonsense, but I did not really understand what bracket drag racing was, so I decided to spend a Saturday morning finding out.

We all must have some image in our minds about drag racing, like expensive special-purpose cars going 1/4 mile in a straight line. Sort of sounds dumb, juvenile and low brow.

Well, that may or may not be the way it was, but bracket racing is both a real challenge and a ball.

Somewhere along the line, someone came up with the handicap system, where money and power are really irrelevant. Any car can compete, including a clapped-out taxi cab.

The game is both simple and very complex. First you go through a runs series of practice to establish how fast or slow you Next you choose a time you are. are comfortable with. Any time you want really. Then in the competitive elimination, everybody has a personally selected bracket If your time time. is 14.00 seconds and your competitor's bracket time is 15, he gets a one second head start on you. The differential is all controlled by computer and the two starting lights, or Christmas trees (three yellow, green and red lights).

So far, this is all simple, but you have three ways to lose and only one way to win. You win if you get to the finish line first without going under your bracket time. However, you lose if:

 you start before your green light goes on, that is, you "redlight".
 the other guy gets to the finish line first.
 you get to the finish line first without redlighting, but you went faster than your bracket time.

If any of this sounds confusing, comlicated and maddening, you are starting to get the message.

At Atco, Mark Schnoerr won Top Eliminator, beating a Corvette. The Vette was one-plus seconds faster in the 1/4 mile, but Mark beat him by being 1/100 of a second above his bracket time. The Corvette folks were stunned despondent. Mark was and The slower car won triumphant. because he knew his car perfectly, enabling him to be consistent without going going too fast.

At the end of the event, the Corvette Club invited us to join them at Maple Grove Drag Strip on August 19 at 9:00 am.

Porsches may not be drag racers, but with bracket racing, that does not matter. It is a ball. Come join us.


