My First Track Event

I was sitting on the hillside overlooking the "esses" at Watkins Glen, at my first Reisentöter track event, and as my father went by in his 911 I cheered for him like a little kid. That's because I was one. I was about 10, it was about 1970 and he was driving a Leaf Green 1968 911L. The Glen was pretty much the same then as it is now. The bathrooms are better now (really) and I don't remember all the grandstands as they have now, but I surely remember watching the cars running up the hill through the "esses" and winding out down the backstretch, a lot like now. At the June 1996 Reisentöter event there, one of my students drove a 1972 911T. As we circled the track I couldn't help but think about my Father in his early 911. The "upside down" 901 transmission, the sound of the 2.2 L six (Dad's was a 2 liter) and the true sports car feel of one of the early examples of the greatest sports car ever built. I remember that day in 1970 like it was yesterday; my first track event. When my father came off the track I was so excited, I asked him the same question all of our friends ask us who aren't Porsche people: "how fast did you go?" His answer: "I don't have time to look at the speedometer very much, but about 110 on the back straight." Wow!

In those days the 911 was, as it is today, a car that relies on engine efficiency and handling, and light weight to outperform cars it races against that have much bigger engines. (If you were at the Glen in June and saw the red Z28 running in the Red Run Group you know what I mean.)

When I was a kid, nearly every weekend we would do something car-(Porsche) related. Dad's big thing was "speed trials," or what today is autocross. He would put Goodyear "Blue Streaks" on the car and remove the stock muffler and replace it with what he called a "stinger." It was called that because, I think, it created what my mother called "that awful noise." I thought it sounded really cool. He had a guy in town build him a trailer and sometimes for far away events we towed the car behind our motor home. Like to Watkins Glen. But normally we would all pile into the 911 and drive to the Scranton/Wilkes-Barre area, probably the parking lot at Eynon Drug, for a NE PENNA SCCA or Corvette Club speed trial. Or to a hill

climb at Hobo Hill in NY State. Or to Summit Point or Watkins Glen, or, wherever. Those of you who understand can relate, it doesn't matter where or what, as long as it involves driving the car. Anyway, I don't know what all the fuss is about concerning rear seat room in 911s, I had no trouble falling asleep in the back seat with my head leaned up against the roll bar (yes, even then safety was paramount) and that wonderful sound and vibration and warmth of the engine under and behind me.

Considering all the trophies ("dust collectors" as you-know-who referred to them), I think Dad did really well. (I'm kidding a bit about my mother. We regularly reminisce about those wonderful Sundays in the Porsche together. I know she enjoyed it as much as we all did.) I often remember Fastest Time of Day trophies and firsts in C Production. The production classes were what today would be a Stock class. His big competition (at least for FTD) was from big fast Corvettes and Mustangs and Cobras and such. And my mother thought the little 911 was loud!

Marty Newman was his name (he sadly died of natural causes in 1973) and we were very proud and touched to come to find out years later that North Eastern PA SCCA had established the Martin Newman Memorial Trophy presented each year to the clubs biggest enthusiast. His impact on the sports car world and the memory of that little Porsche 911 "Giant Killer" lives on.

My brother Dave was the first to carry on the Porsche legacy when he bought his first 911 a few years ago. This year he is competing in SCCA autocross on a nationally competitive level in a lightning fast ASP 911. He got me into it and now, I too, am hooked in a big way (just ask my girlfriend, who wonders why I can't get my you know what out of bed on a normal day, but fly out of bed at the crack of dawn to go autocrossing or to the track). An autocross friend was heard to comment on our (especially my brother's) driving prowess by saying: "...how can we compete with somebody who learned to left foot brake before they could walk." Well, I don't know about that, but I did learn the line through the "esses" at The Glen when I was ten years old.

Thanks for letting me share these memories with you, and I look forward to creating new ones with my Porsche Club friends of today. See you at the track.

You've entered your Porsche in concours competitions. learned to autocross it, done a couple of rallies.... You even do your own maintenance and give technical advice to fellow Porsche owners. You've experienced the entire range of Porsche-related activities, right?


