






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President's Message



We are starting the season with our 11th annual SUPERTECH session at Dougherty Automotive Services on March 8. Their bays will be available from 9am - 1pm for club members who want to bring their Porsches in to do some work. The Dougherty experts will be around to answer questions and the Parts counter will be open just in case you forgot something. Lifts will be assigned on a first come-first serve basis (\$5 fee) and will be limited to 2 hours. Please limit your plans to maintenance and minor repairs in order to stay within the time limits. Carma

If there is one statement that is safe to make about PCA members, it would be that most are not your average "point A to point B" type owners. A 1985 944 magazine ad said it all: "In 1948, Professor Porsche decided any car that merely got you from here to there, just didn't go far enough." In 48 years, nothing has changed. Even daily driver Porsches are rarely subjected to the rigors and abuse most Americans dish out to their cars. A fact made abundantly clear by a fact I recently heard. In the U.S., of cars ten years of age or older, half are already in the junkyard.

It wasn't always that way. In America, the automobile was king in its first 75 years of existence. It was the cornerstone of a sociological revolution that gripped the nation. Post WWII prosperity, automotive advancements and improved roads gave Americans what they longed for: freedom and mobility. The 50s with fins and 60s with muscle gave us many of Detroit's most memorable. And when we hit the road the drive-in movie theater, diners, real gas stations and the drive-in hamburger joints were there. Whether you had a 356 or a '57 Chevy, these fondly and forever fused car culture and Carma into American history. But the novelty and prestige of car ownership eventually waned. Freedom to roam the road became the norm as many families got two cars. With more disposable income, the automobile became disposable as well. Progress seemed to indicate things were no longer built to last.

For PCA members, the American level of carnage for Porsches would be inconceivable. But down through the years, a few Porsches have met a untimely end and given their parts so that others might live. In 1996, America celebrated the 100th anniversary of the automobile. The Germans, known for technical innovation, reached the same milestone ten years before. Why any particular model or marque retains an almost religious following is without question its Carma. You can talk about innovation, design, quality and production numbers, but the great intangible may simply be appeal and/or performance. From the obscure to the obvious.

Many start out early as car lovers, but fall along the wayside. Current gloomy American automobile mortality rates and general apathy toward cars is unfortunate. But there IS hope. A hardcore element of enthusiasts survives today along with their beloved automobiles. Porsche is as well represented among those who treasure their automobiles as any marque worldwide. You may have come to know the marque with an early model or come up through the ranks driving GM, Ford or Mopar before getting your first Porsche. While the T-shirt that says, "I love my wife. I worship my car," might be a little strong, it is a fever. Porsches evoke great emotion and the relationship often runs deep. Their unique blend of racing heritage, breeding, exhilarating performance, exclusiveness and beautiful design have made them legendary. Only two original designs have successfully survived for longer than 30 years. Both are German; both are Porsche creations and both classics: The VW Beetle and the Porsche 911. Only now, after 48 years, has the one-millionth Porsche been made for the world. Each has its own individual personality and every model is coveted by someone in the PCA.

While many fail to understand Carma, it is hard to imagine our lives without it. Chevron's new television ad series with talking cars speaks volumes about the relationship between car and owner. In the ads, the cars often chastise owners for failure to take better care of them on the inside and out and for not keeping "their" stall in the garage clear of family clutter. While you may not talk to your car, I'll bet your car may have a nickname, personalized plates, or custom floormats, cover, wheels, luggage, chips, exhaust, a special parking space, all of the above or more. And when you ask, it does respond with that famous performance. The kind that often elevates life above the mundane. The pride of ownership is obvious. Even Porsche, with a 1991 911 poster, speaks of their unique personality: "It's like children. You can't understand until you have one."

Indeed, the word Karma itself is a far-eastern religious term often used in the transcendental 60s. Informally it is usually defined as a distinctive aura, atmosphere or feeling. Sounds like a Porsche to me. Even when it may be resting in your garage. Though some of our friends are not the fastest around anymore, it is not how fast you go, it is how well you go fast. We all know Porsches are the class of the automotive world. Whether you call the experience of ownership magical, mystical or Carma, "nothing else even comes close."



Porsches Take GTS-1, GTS-2 Class Wins At 1997 Rolex 24 At Daytona

DAYTONA BEACH, FL., Feb. 2 -- Porsches claimed victories in both the GTS-1 and GTS-2 classes here Sunday at the 1997 Rolex 24 at Daytona IMSA sports car race.

The Rohr Motorsport team of Jochen Rohr, Andy Pilgrim, Harald Grohs and Arnd Meier won the GTS-1 class in a Porsche 911 Turbo, while the Roock Racing team of Ralf Kelleners, Patrice Grouselard, Andre Ahrle and Claudia Huertgen won GTS-2, also in a Porsche 911 Turbo. Porsche also had a late shot at the GTS-3 crown, but the Jim Matthews Racing team of Jim Matthews, David Murry, Hurley Haywood and Doc Bundy could not reel in a BMW M3.

The Rohr team, out of Cincinnati, had to hold off the hardcharging Champion Porsche team of Hans Stuck, Bill Adam and Thierry Boutsen to finish fifth, overall.

The Roock team, who are the defending 24 Hours of LeMans GT-2 champs, not only captured GTS-2 top honors, but second-place in GTS-2 as well with the trio of Phillipe De Craene, Zac Brown and Dirk Layer.

Overall race winners again came out of IMSA's premier class, the World Sports Car class. James Weaver, Butch Leitzinger, Rob Dyson, Eliot Forbes-Robinson, Andy Wallace, John Paul, Jr. and John Schneider piloted a Ford R&S MK III to victory covering 690 laps and more than 2,400 miles with an average race speed of 102 MPH.

The Rohr/Roock victories marked the 26th time a Porsche 911 has been to victory lane at Daytona International Speedway.


