



Although I am sure that by now most members have heard, I feel that I would be somewhat remiss if I did not mention the tragic accident that occurred at our Club Race. Riesentöter member Mike Keller of West Chester, PA was seriously injured in the single-car crash of his aubergine colored '72 911 into the wall of NASCAR Turn #1 while qualifying on the morning of Sunday, August 17, 1997. He suffered a closed-head injury but no broken bones, no bleeding and apparently no spinal cord injury. Mike was airlifted from Pocono to the Central Nervous

System Unit at Lehigh Valley Hospital where he was listed in critical but stable condition. As of this writing, Mike was still in a coma but responding to some verbal stimulus. He may be transferred to Bryn Mawr Hospital shortly.

Mike's wife, Ilene, and his parents Norma and Bill Keller are by his side continuously. RTR's New Public Address ("PA") System by Bob McCullen, PA Coordinator

Riesentöter has purchased a new PA system for use at various meetings, races, social and technical events, etc.

A call in the June *Der Gasser* for members to help me in purchasing such a system resulted in four member phone calls. I would especially like to thank Todd Simpson of George's Music Stores as well as the following members for their technical support and purchasing suggestions: Fred Bernardo of Fred's Music in Reading, Eric Lang and John Hoey.

We bought a single JBL EON 10 speaker with an integrated 85-watt amplifier and separate stand, a wired microphone and stand, a wireless lavaller or lapel microphone and various controls and protective cases. We tried to keep it as simple as possible to operate, setup and transport (even in a Porsche). It is also very flexible in that it can handle a guest speaker who prefers to use a wired mike in one spot and the wireless mike to move around or demonstrate something.

If you need the system for your Riesentöter event, please call me and I will coordinate the delivery and setup instruction which will be included. My phone number and address are listed in the back of *Der Gasser*.

Since I don't plan on attending every event where the PA system will be used, I would like to set up a list of volunteers with previous experience setting up and using PA-type equipment. Now that Bill O'Connell has reported on the Glenn track weekend, I feel free to talk about it. I have had my driving likened to various bodily functions, but never referred to as a "hiccup". That would be a complement. Stuffing my Turbo S into the baby blue armco was a traumatic experience; however, now that the dust has settled I have found many positive and useful things to share with those willing to listen.

- It makes a lot of sense to have on-track insurance. You never know when the unexpected will happen. It was the last thing I expected while having so much fun.
- Don't become passive on the track like its an amusement park ride. You must consciously keep the car under control and stay within the limits of your driving skill. (Sounds obvious, but this novice got overconfident and a little lazy on the third day).
- 3) More power to make the rear tires stick coming out of a turn has it limitations. When the lateral force on the tire exceeds its ability to grip, it won't (grip that is).
- Don't surprise the car. It will surprise you back! Mine surprised me before I knew what happened.
- 5) Exploit the knowledge of your instructor, frequently, especially after you have soloed.
- 6) Cherish your friends and Club members. They are fantastic! I want to send a very special Thank You to the following folks who helped me out and were inconvenienced in the process: John Heckman for trailering my car back to Philly; Tony Bonanni whose turbo was taken off John's trailer and had to be driven home; Bill O'Connell who actually drove Tony's car all the way home; Vicki O'Connell who had to drive home alone without Bill; Andrew (with the GTI) who brought me back to Philly, and everyone else who found something positive to say about my experience. Keep on "trackin."

Congratulations Dave!!

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

The 1998 Porsche Story (Courtesy Porsche Cars North America, Inc.)

Porsche goes into its golden anniversary year in 1998 with an international reputation for building sports cars with a combination of acceleration, handling, braking, driving excitement, design excellence and durability few others can match. The Porsche mystique comes in two different model lines for 1998: the venerable rear-engine 911 and the new mid-engine Boxster.

There are four distinct body shapes in the 1998 Porsche 911 family: the Carrera S Coupe "widebody", the Carrera Cabriolet, which uses the standard 911 bodyshell, the Carrera 4S Coupe, which combines the widebody look with the Porsche all-wheeldrive powertrain, the Carrera 4 Cabriolet, incorporating all-wheel drive and a convertible body style, and the glass-top Carrera Targa.

The newest 911 model, the Carrera S Coupe, introduced in March at the 1997 New York International Auto Show, incorporates the widebody front and rear body work of the 911 Turbo and 911 Carrera 4S, with a split rear spoiler grille, "Cup Design" 17-inch alloy wheels, steel grey interior trim, black leather instrument panel and door trim, and Carrera S identification on the rear engine cover. The Carrera S is now the entry-level 911, with all of these features at no increase in price compared to last year's Carrera Coupe.

There is a single engine for the 1998 911 family, the 282 horsepower (210 kW) normally aspirated, horizontally opposed six-cylinder with a Varioram' induction system that greatly increases midrange torque and driveability.

The Porsche 911 offers two transmissions: a standard six-speed manual for all models, and the patented Tiptronic S automatic with its computer-programmed shifting and steering wheelmounted shift controls for spirited driving with the convenience of an automatic. (The Tiptronic S transmission is not available on the Carrera 4S Coupe or Carrera 4 Cabriolet.)

In addition to the five models in the 911 family, Porsche offers the new Boxster, introduced in early 1997, with its 2.5-liter water-cooled boxer engine, five-speed manual or Tiptronic S transmissions, in both convertible and optional hardtop configurations.

For the 1998 model year, the new Boxster roadster will offer standard front and side air bags, but is otherwise unchanged from the 1997 model.

All Porsche 911 models and the Boxster will offer optional child seats that can automatically disable the passenger air bag system for greater child safety.
