





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AUTOCROSS 1998

Even though it is still January (February by the time you read this article) Bob Wiegand and I have been working to organize this year's schedules and program. We have been able to lock in the dates for this year and I strongly urge everyone to mark their calendars for the following dates:

APRIL 19. School. Here is your chance to learn everything there is to know about driving. This is the perfect stepping stone before attempting high-speed track events. We, at AX, only reach 70 MPH...... on tight turns that is. No, not really, but an experienced AXer can probably red line in 2nd gear.

MAY 17, JUNE 7, JUNE 28, JULY 26, AUGUST 9, AUGUST 30, SEPTEMBER 27, AND OCTOBER 18. These are regular competition dates that will count for points for end-of-season awards. As of this printing, all the events will be held at Camden, along the Delaware River just south of the Benjamin Franklin bridge.

As a point of interest, every year we try to make improvements. Last year we acquired a trailer to house the cones and all other paraphernalia. This year we will have state-of-the-art timing equipment and software to keep score and compile points for the entire season. We will adopt SCCA car classifications and use PAX time factors to place every car on the same playing field. This should make competition interesting because a person driving a 356 speedster can compare himself (or herself or itself) with another driver in a 930 turbo. Tires will not matter, so the stickier tires you use, the better you will be. Under this basis, we will have only 2 classes: regular and novices. NOVICES will be defined as a driver with 5 or less events accumulated over any number of years.

For those of you who do not know the way to the Camden site, here are the directions: From I-76 go East and follow signs to the Ben Franklin Bridge (676E). Stay in right lane and make first right immediately after the toll gates to Cooper Ave. Right on Cooper to Delaware. Lot "7" is directly in front of you with the Philadelphia skyline in the background. The lot sits almost directly underneath the bridge on the south side. The adjacent buildings have been removed and now there is a clear view of the Sony Entertainment Center and the Camden Aquarium. Bring your camera, there are great photo opportunities. See you there, OK? BE THERE OR BE SQUARE!!

Track Tech Notes by Mark Winkle, Tech Chairman

Changes to Instructor Tech

For the past years we have allowed instructors to self tech their cars for track events. We are modifying that policy this year in the interest of improving safety. We know that instructors are conscientious about safety and keep their cars in good condition; but, we also realize that they may not see everything that might be a problem. Our objective here is to make sure that a second person looks the car over to spot anything that the instructor missed. Instructors must get their car teched by a recognized inspector (commercial mechanic or Riesentöter tech inspector) one time this year before their first track event. When you submit the stamped and signed tech form, you will receive an instructor's tech sticker that will be good for our events for the rest of the year. Even RTR inspectors cannot inspect their own car - you have to get someone else to do it. Once you have done this, you can self-tech for the remainder of the year, as before. You are also exempt from grid tech at all events. We realize that this places an additional burden on our valued instructors and we instituted this change only after much discussion. We hope you understand and will support us in this decision. The Supertech at Dougherty's will be a great time to get your annual tech done. Give me a call if you have questions.

Fire Extinguishers No Longer Required for Track Events While we still recommend mounting a fire extinguisher in your car, they are no longer required for track events in any run group. If you have a fire extinguisher, it MUST be mounted with sturdy metal clips and bolted securely to the chassis or roll bar. Plastic brackets are <u>not</u> acceptable. These may seem secure but will break on impact - releasing the fire extinguisher to bounce around the cabin of the car.

RENO, NEVADA, Jan. 12, 1998 -- A long awaited anniversary of one of the world's most revered automakers will take place during 1998. Fifty years ago, on June 3, 1948, the first production car to bear the Porsche name was completed in the tiny village of Gmund, Austria.

Created by Prof. Ferry Porsche and designated the 356, this initial sports car launched the Porsche marque in the automobile industry. As the first Porsche, it also laid the technical foundation for many succeeding and highly prized Porsche models.

Porsche's momentous 50th anniversary will be celebrated throughout the year at numerous worldwide activities including many of North America's premier automotive events. In America, Porsche will be the featured marque at the Amelia Island Concours d'Elegance (April 18) in Florida, the Meadow Brook Hall Concours d'Elegance and Historic Races (Aug. 1-2) in Michigan and the Monterey Historic Automobile Races (Aug. 14-16) in Northern California. The Pebble Beach Concours d'Elegance (Aug. 16), the National Automobile Museum (April 20 - Aug. 9) in Reno and the Petersen Automotive Museum (Sept. 11 - Nov. 6) in Los Angeles will highlight special displays commemorating Porsche's golden anniversary. And Watkins Glen International will hold a unique Double Fifty Porsche Celebration (Aug. 28-30) honoring both Porsche's anniversary and the 50th anniversary of the rebirth of American road racing at the New York race course.

The Porsche AG Museum in Germany will provide a selection of outstanding historic automobiles for these North American activities, several of which are making their first appearance on the continent. In addition, track events will be attended by such famous Porsche race drivers as Hurley Haywood, Vic Elford, George Follmer and Brian Redman.
