
President's Message

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April at Holbert's!!!!!!!!!!!! Come one, come all!!!!!!!!!!



Ferdinand Porsche dies (PCA Editors' News Service)

VIENNA, Austria, Mar 27, 1998 -- Ferdinand Porsche, founder of German sportscar maker Porsche AG, has died in the Austrian mountain resort of Zell am See, the Austrian news agency APA said Friday. He was 88. It quoted the Porsche company in Salzburg, Austria, as saying he would be buried privately in Zell am See and that an official funeral service would take place in Stuttgart, Germany. No further details were given.

Porsche, or Ferry as he was known, was born near the Austrian capital of Vienna, the son of engineer Ferdinand Porsche and his wife Aloisia on Sept. 19, 1909. The family moved to Stuttgart where Ferry Porsche came to work in his father's engineering company, which produced the prototype Volkswagen in 1936. A year earlier, Porsche married Dorothea Reitz of Stuttgart. They had four sons. In 1950, he started producing his first sportscar, the 356. It was succeeded by the Porsche 911 in 1963. Porsche, who in the 1930s acquired a vacation home in Zell am See, led the Stuttgart company until 1972. He gave up his vote on the board in 1993.

Tech Session at Holbert's

Date: May 16, 1998

- Place Holbert's Porsche 1607 Easton Rd Warrington, PA 18976 (215) 343-1600
- Time: 9am 2pm
- Directions: Holbert's Porsche is located on Rt. 611, about 2.5 miles south of downtown Doylestown, just south of the intersection of Almshouse and Rt. 611.

Holbert's will be sponsoring our tech session on May 16. Two lifts will be reserved for track event tech <u>only</u> - no repairs or maintenance. The remaining lifts will be available on a first come - first served basis for repair and maintenance. A modest fee (\$5) is collected for use of the lift. Coffee and doughnuts/ bagels/muffins will be available in the morning and we will order pizza for lunch. Bring the tools and parts you need for your work (don't use the shop's tools or equipment without talking to the mechanic first). Holbert's mechanics will be on hand in if you need some advise and the parts counter will be open in case you forgot something.

These tech sessions are scheduled to coincide with a track event, but by no means are they limited to track participants. Anyone in the Club can bring their Porsche for maintenance or minor repairs. Just limit yourself to repairs that you can complete within the scheduled time. The shop will have their mechanics on hand to answer any questions and there are usually plenty of club people around with lots of experience. It is a great time to meet other people in the club. You can even drop by just to see what is going on and learn from watching other people. Give me a call if you have any questions. See you there.

Other Tech Notes

Just a reminder - Instructors must get their car teched before their first track event this year. See the announcement in the February Der Gasser for details. The tech session at Holbert's will be a great time to get this done. 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THE GOOD NEWS and BAD NEWS!

Changes in O.N T.RACK C.OVERAGE for 1998

First--The Bad News: Through no fault of our own, coverage for Drivers' Education events has been suspended. We are working hard to find another insurance company to provide it. We are optomistic. We will get the word out as soon as we know.

Now--The Good News: Nothing else has changed! Except the cost. (It's lower!)

Do you like to drive your collector car? Do you have it insured through one of the collector vehicle, select auto, or specialty car policies on the market today but dislike the restrictions they place on it's use? "Whadya mean I can't drive my Porsche to work once in a while?!" *The Good News:* No drivers under age 21. No coverage for racing or participation in Drivers' Education events (stay tuned.) No other restrictions.


Have you attempted applying for one of those other policies but were turned off by all the paperwork? "What am I, a circus animal jumping through all these hoops?"The Good News: Simple, one page application.

We think we've got what you need: a limited mileage (2500 or 5000 miles annually), high liability, agreed value, low deductible, full coverage automobile insurance policy. It's priced like the others, is easy to apply for, but it is far less restrictive. We at CHASE & HECKMAN, INC. *still* call it the O.T.C. Policy. Because it's C. overage that's O. n the right T. rack. We think you'll call it *The Good News*. Phone us today for a quote.

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The purpose of Riesentöter Autocross is to challenge and improve driving skills in a safe, controlled environment. Nothing needs to be changed or added to your car, but there are common sense safety procedures which must be followed. It is each driver's responsibility to read and observe the following rules.

Generals

- 1. Each driver must wear an "M" or "SA" rated helmet carrying a 1990 or later Snell approval sticker. For those purchasing a new helmet, an "SA" rated is strongly recommended, but 1995 "M" is acceptable. LOANER HELMETS ARE AVAILABLE FOR NEW DRIVERS.
- 2. Metal to metal seat belts, securely anchored are required.
- 3. Sneakers, tennis shoes or other rubber soled shoes are recommended. High heels, and the like will not be allowed.
- 4. Roll bars are recommended for all open cars, but not mandatory.
- 5. Tire and wheel combinations must be completely covered by the bodywork and have sufficient clearance to prevent rubbing that could be considered to be dangerous.
- 6. All cars must pass an on site safety inspection. All loose articles must be removed prior to the safety inspection. Having the car inspected is the responsibility of the driver. A car that has not been inspected will not be allowed to compete. Late inspections are at the convenience of the tech inspectors.
- 7. A driver may only enter one (1) car in an event.
- 8. A maximum of 2 drivers are allowed per car.
- 9. NO passengers are allowed at any time, except for pre approved region instructors. Runs taken with instructors are for practice and will not be timed.
- 10. All rules are the same for novice, ladies and veterans.
- 11. All drivers must work at a flagging station, or other work station assigned. Any driver who does not work as assigned may not be allowed to drive or may forfeit championship points, at the discretion of the event chair person.
- 12. NO ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGES OF ANY TYPE MAY BE CONSUMED BY ANY PERSON DURING THE DRIVING EVENT. THE USE OF ANY ILLEGAL RE-FLEX AFFECTING DRUGS IS STRICTLY PROHIB-ITED.
- 13. Registration begins at 9:00 am. Tech inspection closes at 10:00 am. First car off at 10:20. Late arrivals will be penalized at the discretion of the AX committee.
- 14. PCA member registration fee: \$18.00 Non members \$20.00

CAR CLASSIFICATION

- * Cars are placed into classes so that cars of approximately the same capabilities compete with each other. Club race people will find these classifications very familiar.
- * Proper classification is the responsibility of the entrant.

Misclassification, higher or lower can be protested. Results in increased performance will move the car into the next higher class. Deliberate cheating will not be accepted and dismissal for the event shall be at the discretion of the event chair person. WE STRIVE TO OPERATE IN A SELF AND PEER GOVERNING HONOR SYSTEM.

- * Non-Porsches Will compete in their own class using SCCA rules, classes, and awards shall be based on PAX times.

DEFINITIONS: (see classes)

- **STOCK:** Any car which is as received from the factory. Classes "C" through "K". A car may have 5 modification points as determined from the modification schedule and remain in this category. 6 to 11 modification points moves car up <u>one</u> class. 12 to 17 modification points moves car up two classes.
- **PREPARED:** A car which has accumulated 6 to 11 points in class "C", or 12 to 17 points in class "D" from the modification schedule.
- **SUPER:** Any car with more than 18 points, or a "stock" car listed in "C" class that has 12 to 17 modification points.
- **NOVICE:** Person who is in his /her first year of autocrossing. If you participated in one (1) or more autocrosses last year, you are a veteran this year. Special exceptions may be granted on an individual case, at the discretion of the Autocross chair person. 2 wins in this class moves driver to regular classes.



My First Day of School (Porsche Club Driver's Ed at Pocono) by Jim Zelinskie

Like most red-blooded, American males, I fantasized about being a race-car driver. Yes, I watched Speed Racer. (that Mammoth-Car sure would make a fine tow vehicle). And through the years, I slowly climbed the ladder of automobiles from Fords to Hondas to Audi and Nissan 300ZX. Boy I loved that Z. But in 1995 the Z finally reached retirement age and I began to look for the next rung on the ladder.

Strangely, a service appointment for my Audi led me to my next car. There they were, in the showroom of Holbert's...shiny new Porsches. OK, so I bought a 1988 Carrera cabriolet. It wasn't new, but it sure was shiny. Only 14,000 miles and it was flawless.

As I was handed an application to PCA I was told that the local chapter does track events. Huh?! What?! I can take my car where? Really? Pocono, wow!...Watkins Glen, no way!...Summit Point, get out!...Jefferson Circuit, cool!...what's Jefferson Circuit? So six months, one helmet, one rollbar and one tech inspection later, I'm arriving at Pocono Raceway to drive my "new" baby on the track.

As instructed, I arrive early and actually get garage space. Somehow I expected the garages to be a little fancier, like that show on TV with the polished, checkerboard floor. I unpack my tool box, remove the carpets, clean the windshield and I'm ready to go. Now what do I do? What are all these other people doing? They sure look busy, and why are some of them wearing red wrestling shoes? Some of the cars here don't look like they were driven to work yesterday, in fact some weren't even driven to the track! That's a whole other world.

Registration, Grid Tech (a quick safety inspection at the track), and the drivers meeting go smoothly. All beginners are then directed to classroom instruction. There I learn the necessary vocabulary and basic techniques used to get around the racetrack. OK, I understand the flags, braking, turn-in and apex, but are you guys serious? If I find myself going too fast in a turn, don't lift off the accelerator?! That's a good one.

There is no way to describe the feeling you get the first time you drive out onto a real race track. To see the size of the track...to think of the people who have driven here...to see the huge black mark on the wall where Ernie Ervin hit after lifting off the accelerator in the turn. OK, now I believe you guys.


After a 20 minute session that feels like 20 seconds, I begin to get more comfortable with the track. Heck, I may even shift to third next session. By the next session I begin to get comfortable with the constant sound of my tires squealing in turns. Either I'm going really fast or I can't hit an apex to save my life (or my instructor's life)...I think its the apex thing. I also begin to get

comfortable with the idea that these tires may not live up to their 40,000 mile guarantee.

Just when I think I'm getting good, and driving my car at its limit, my instructor invites me to ride as his passenger in the instructor's session. We climb into his dead-stock '73 911T and he proceeds to do things with that car that can't be possible. And darned if he doesn't hit every apex too. After one lap with him, I realized that my Carrera is yawning from boredom as I take it through the turns... especially when I actually hit an apex.

I must have gone around that track another thousand times in my sleep that night and I couldn't wait to start again the next morning. For the last session of the weekend, after plenty more classroom and track time, my instructor signs me off to solo. Of course, thinking I'm Speed Racer, I brake too late into turn two, really miss the apex, and spin into the grass. Yeah, I'm a little embarrassed. But I certainly was not the first to spin and no harm was done to me or my car. Off track on the north course of Pocono is all grass. This is the safest track on our schedule and the best place to learn. Driver's Ed is such a great time, and to prove I really could learn, I had to sign up for the next event, and the next, and the next...

If you have ever considered taking your Porsche to a Driver's Ed event. DO IT! Riesentöter members are incredibly fortunate. Not only do we have access to some of the greatest courses in the country, but the instructors in this region are of the highest caliber. Many also instruct for professional performance driving schools that charge four times the cost of a Porsche club event.
