



993 Litronic Headlight Installation by Bob Jacobson, Sacramento Valley Region (from *The Drifter*)

I just finished installation of the Porsche Litronic Headlight Kit (#000-044-900-15) in my 993 which was easy to install (four hours) but pricey (\$1,400). These produce a blue, low-beam light by electrical arc in gas to produce double the light of halogen lights with 30% reduction in current consumption. The Kit included two headlight units, control units and wire.

Begin by removing the "old" headlights by simply turning a lever inside the trunk on each fender. Next to the lever are three factory-drilled holes which are covered over. Remove the three hole covers and pop-rivet the control units to each fender. Route the new wire harness through a gasket to back of the headlight. Twist the old headlight socket and pull it out to install new wires. The hardest job I found was to remove old wire clips from the socket (use a bent-wire "U" into each side of clip to release). Install the headlight socket into the bracket and install new Litronic headlight units.

Headlight adjustment is easy; with car level, use 5mm Allen wrench into side of headlights as directed in owners manual.

The light produced ahead of the car is almost like daylight. Although pricey, with few cars now using them (911 Turbo, BMW, MB, and Lincoln), I am sure with wider application the price will drop. Also, for your information, Porsche issued a Technical Bulletin for this job.

bypass (don't take 422 Business). You need to be in the left hand lane for the bypass. Take the second exit (Rt 222/ Lancaster Ave). Turn left at the end of the exit ramp onto Rt 222 (Lancaster Ave.) Vision is 12 blocks, on the right hand side. From the Turnpike, take Rt 222 north to Read-

ing. Vision will be on you left hand side.

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Riesentöter Spring Rally Wrap-Up by Bill Frey, Rally Master



A sea of Porsches getting ready to start the Spring Rally. (Photo courtesy Bob Snow.)






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Watkins Glen Driver's Education



Allegheny Region of the Porsche Club of America will host a Driver's Education Event at the world renown Watkins Glen Race Track on

Thursday and Friday, July 23 and 24 (note: the Upper New York Wine and Crafts Festival will be held at Watkins Glen on Saturday and Sunday following the Driver's Education event). Registration and Safety checks will begin promptly at 7:15 AM, Thursday morning. This is a great opportunity to learn more about your car and enhance your driving skills; however, this is not a racing school. All drivers will be paired with an instructor and will be expected to stay well within their driving limits. First Timers are Especially Welcome! It is not known currently if racing fuel or concessions will be available at the track. Details on this as well as social aspects of the weekend will be in the registration packet.

REQUIREMENTS

- 1. Helmet 1990 or later SNELL SA or M rated (SA recommended).
- 2. Seatbelts (3 point minimum) driver and passenger.
- 3. Roll bar and arm restraints if open car bar must be taller than driver & provide protection for passenger. Arm restraints required for both driver and instructor. Sunroofs must be fully closed.
- 4. Minimum 3/32" tire tread depth.
- 5. Long sleeve cotton shirt, long cotton pants, leather or canvas shoes (driving suit & shoes recommended).

Porsche in the News (PCA Editors' News Service)

Boxster's Symbol - uBID, Inc., the Online Auction outfit, offered a new 1998 Porsche Boxster equipped with the "sports package," in a month-long auction which closed on May 26, 1998. Bidding for the Boxster started at \$7 with \$1-increments. uBid, a subsidiary of Creative Computers, Inc., provided free delivery of the auctioned Porsche Boxster to the victorious bidder anywhere in the continental United States. Frank Khulusi, Creative's Chief Executive Officer, said, "Porsche represents the dream of hitting the gas on the open road. We believe it's a good symbol for the fast-paced action on our uBid website."

Hat Trick for Fisichella - Benetton Formula One driver, Giancarlo Fisichella, escaped unhurt after a high speed crash in testing at Barcelona, April 29. The Italian, who crashed out of the previous weekend's San Marino Grand Prix and also crashed his Porsche Boxster road car during the same Grand Prix weekend, made it three in a row when he spun heavily into the wall at the end of the main straight of the Circuit de Catalunya at 180 mph.

SUV Watch - The Frankfurter newspaper, Allgemeine Zeitung, reported that Porsche and VW had agreed to cooperatively build a Jeep-style, sport utility vehicle, but in two different versions. The supervisory boards of both companies reportedly would meet on June 2 and 3 to approve the project. The paper added that VW and Porsche would decide in the autumn at the earliest where to build the vehicle, which will have its market debut in autumn 2001 or later. It said market watchers estimated VW could sell 80,000 of the vehicles per year while Porsche's different version could sell 20,000. Porsche's model is to be priced at about 120,000 marks, so its potential annual revenues from the vehicle could amount to about half Porsche's 1997 sales of about four billion marks, the paper said.

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
