Tech Session at Vision Porsche

Vision Porsche will be sponsoring our tech session on June 5. A lift will be reserved for track event tech only - no repairs or maintenance. The remaining lifts will be available on a first come - first served basis for repair and maintenance. A modest fee (\$5) is collected for use of the lift. Coffee and doughnuts/bagels/muffins will be available in the morning and we will order pizza for lunch. Bring the tools and parts you need for your work (don't use the shop's tools or equipment without talking to the mechanic first). Vision's mechanics will be on hand in if you need some advise and there some of club members around with lots of experience. Give me a call if you have any questions. See the calendar or web page for the tech sessions for the rest of the year.

Instructor Track Tech

We will follow the same policy as last year concerning tech of instructors cars. Instructors must get their car teched by a recognized inspector (commercial mechanic or Riesentoter tech inspector) one time this year before their first track event. When you submit the stamped and signed tech form, you will receive an instructors tech sticker that will be good for our events for the rest of the year. Even RTR inspectors cannot inspect their own car - you have to get someone else to do it. Once you have done this, you can self tech for the remainder of the year (you must still fill out a tech form for all events). You are also exempt from grid tech at all events.

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

Supercharged 911 Carrera

When we think of forced induction 911s, we usually think Turbos. In recent years, a few tuners have offered supercharging conversions as an alternative. The advantages of supercharging are a simpler installation and no "turbo lag". Ever wonder how well these conversions work? I decided to try it - and the result was a power increase of more than 50%.

My car is a 1986 Carrera Cabriolet which I use as a daily driver. I purchased the car in May of '96. I had never owned a Porsche

of '96. I had never owned a Porsche before this - although I had dreamed about owning one for many years. I found this car to be a blast to drive - the result of a solid chassis, great road feel, and an engine that loves to rev.

Though the stock 3.2 engine had good power, I felt it would me nice to have a little more - about 15-20% would probably do it. So I started looking at bolt-on engine modifications: computer chips, exhaust, mass air flow sensor, K&N air filter, etc. Looking through an

issue of Excellence, I also noticed an add by Supercharging of Knoxville (SoK). They had a kit for my car which was advertised to produce 345hp for \$4795.

During a "Supertech" meeting, I talked with Bill Dougherty from Dougherty Automotive about bolt-on modifications for the 911 Carrera. Bill was very helpful in providing information, and he even let me drive a Carrera equipped with complete B&B exhaust, mass air system, and aftermarket chip. My perception was that this car was perhaps 15% more powerful than mine, most noticeable above 5000rpm. If I ever wanted more than 15%, the next step would be to swap expensive engine components. Given the cost of the bolt-on components and installation, the supercharging kit started sounding good in terms of hp/\$.

I had asked Bill about the SoK kit, and he was also curious - so he offered to call SoK and ask some technical questions. Bill found no obvious negatives, and I also talked with SoK and 2 owners who had the kit installed (references provided by SoK). At this point, it was clear that the total job would cost over \$10000 - including options added to the kit, a tail and turbo deck which would need to be added for clearance, and installation (SoK quoted \$2000 for installation). Oh, well, you only live once - so I

decided to go for it.

Dougherty's did the installation and modification of the rear decklid. Though things generally went well, it was not a job for the average backyard mechanic. There were also a few things to sort out after installation. The main heater blower must be removed or relocated. It turns out that the auxiliary blowers will not operate with the main blower disconnected, so a blower was added below the left rear fender (Flannery Auto Repair of Reading did the custom piping). I also had to adjust the belt tensioner pulley to prevent belt slippage at high boost levels.

Supercharging has delivered what it promised: thrilling acceleration and daily drivability from a bolt-on modification.

So how does it perform? Just floor the accelerator above 3000rpm and you instantly know the blower is working - the difference is far from subtle. The Paxton centrifugal blower produces boost roughly proportional to the square of engine speed, so the power gain is greatest at high rpm. Here are approximate manifold boost readings from my gauge (included in the kit) at full throttle:

1500 rpm 0.5 psi 4000 rpm 4.5 psi 3000 rpm 2 psi 6000 rpm 9 psi

Since I am an engineer, I always want to know numbers. I tested the car before and after the modification by timing full throttle acceleration from 3000rpm-6000rpm in 3rd gear at the same place on the same road. At an ambient temperature of approximately 67F, my times were as follows (average of 2 runs each):

Stock 8.45 seconds
Supercharged 6.1 seconds
% gain 38.5%

This gain is surprisingly consistent with what I would estimate if there were no power loss to run the blower and no loss due to heat of compression.



I estimate peak horsepower gain between 50% and 60% with the peak close to 6000 rpm.

Power change with temperature is greater with the supercharger. At 90F, I timed 6.8 seconds from 3000-6000 rpm. At 37F, the time was an amazing 4.9 seconds! On cold days, full throttle on dry pavement will result in the tires breaking loose above 4000 rpm in 1st gear (and sometimes 2nd also).

What about drivability and other tradeoffs? There is no loss in drivability. The engine is as smooth as stock and there are no unexpected power surges. I drive my 911 in the snow with no problem. I am not sure about fuel economy; it seems somewhat lower, but I can't make a fair comparison - it's hard to stay off the boost for a full tank of gas. I have not noticed any detonation problems in normal driving when using 93 octane.

The only major tradeoff is noise - there is a high pitched whine at high rpm. It is much more pronounced when the throttle is closed. In my opinion, it was too loud for top-down driving. My solution to this was to add a homemade intake silencer, which reduced noise by about 10dB. The level is now reasonable.

After almost 2 years and over 10,000 miles, my supercharged 911 is still running strong. It has been used in autocrosses, but not in track events. So far, Supercharging of Knoxville's kit has delivered what it promised: thrilling acceleration and daily drivability from a bolt-on modification.


